DG Donna's Notes

After a long 6 years there will finally be another Regional Lions Leadership Institute in MD37. It will be held in Montana, October 20-23 inclusive. Lions who have aspirations of becoming leaders in their club, district, or Multiple District should attend. There are approximately 10 places available for our district 37L Lions and I hope to see every one of them used.

The MD and a grant from LCI will be covering most of the cost of the institute but the applicants will be responsible for their transportation and a \$100 registration fee. The cabinet has budgeted money to help defray some of these costs to attendees.

On the same subject, the next Senior Lions Leadership Institute is being held in Oak Brook on November 17 - 20. It is for Lions who have been a club president but have not yet attained the position of First Vice District Governor. The deadline is September 7 so if you're interested please let me know. Meals and hotels are provided but the applicant has to look after their transportation.

As many of you are now aware the MERL team no longer exists and has been replaced with the Global Membership (GMT) Team and the Global Leadership (GLT) Team. In District 37L these teams will be led by CC Tom Hodgson on the GMT and PDG Betty Ann on the GLT.

The first round of information and training for these teams is being held on Sunday, August 28, for the northern half of the MD at Lions Villages Riverside in Edmonton and all Lions are welcome to attend. Please let me know if you are interested.

Our Lions Clubs are falling on tough times with our membership numbers and it is up to every one of us to help increase these numbers. As we stand right now, District 37L is a provisional district as our membership has been below the required 1250 for three years. An average of two new members for each club is all we need. If every one of us just brought in one new member, we would be on top of the world. I'm asking you to ask your wife, your husband, your son or daughter, your sister or brother, to become a family member of Lions. The future of Lions is with the young people you recruit.

International President Dr Tam believes that the success of Lions starts at club level. My own club has said that for years. We need to have effective orientation and keep our new members involved from the start. Our fellow club members are our extended family and we need to treat them like they are our family.

Or new International President Dr. Wing-Kun Tam's theme is "I Believe". I quote him: - "Believe that one person can make a difference. Believe that the entire world can be changed when we come together as Lions. Believe that changing a life or the world - starts with each one of us." He goes on to say - "Believing has three key elements –

We need the courage to try, the commitment to try again, and finally we need to take action.

At the International Convention in Seattle Dr. Tam spoke of his goal to plant a million trees around the world. Like all of us, Dr. Tam in concerned about the environment, and we all know how beneficial trees are. At the time of our District Governors' photo session with Dr. Tam we were each asked to give a pledge for our District of how many trees we could plant my pledge was 1153 - one tree for every member in 37L - Sounds like a lot doesn't it? Well it wasn't. One DG in my class pledged over 4000 trees.

A club in our district has one member who has already planted 80 - 7 percent of our pledge!

And the total pledged world wide was astonishing - 8.7 million trees and still counting. Absolutely unbelievable ---- or is it? ---- After all we are Lions and we can do anything! Please let me know how the count in your zone or club is doing - I want us to double and triple our pledge.

Lion Wanda and I have been participating in learning sessions given by PID Patti on the use of "Webinars" - an unbelievable tool. You can't beat face to face communication but these Webinars are the next best thing. We will be trying to integrate their use in training sessions and perhaps meeting monthly via webinar with the zone chairs. Plan to register soon for the 2011 District convention, November 4 and 5 in Fort Saskatchewan, and the 2012 37L and I Rally to be held January 13 and 14 at the Central Lions Senior Centre. This Lionistic year the Multiple District Convention is being held in Athabasca in May 2012. They are anticipating that the International guest will be President Tam so be sure to register early.

DISTRICT 37L YOUTH ACTIVITIES AWARD

The District Governor will make the decision on the club which is to be presented with the award based on the following criteria. To be eligible for this award, a Club must have done AT LEAST SIX of the following in the Lionistic year.

- 1. Participated in Lions Youth Exchange through their club members personally hosting a youth exchange student.
- Provided a financial contribution to the District 37L Youth Exchange Program or to the MD37 Youth Exchange Program.
- Sponsored youth[s] to travel on the Lions Youth Exchange or to attend a Lions Youth Camp.
- 4. Participated in or financially supported Lions Quest.
- Participated in or financially supported at least two local youth organizations such as Scouts, Girl Guides, minor hockey, minor ball or other organized and recognized non-profit youth groups.
- Provided financial support to the District 37L and Sri Lanka Foster Child Program.
- 7. Made a financial contribution to Camp He Ho Ha.
- 8. Made a financial contribution to Camp Tamarack.
- 9. Sponsored a new Leo club in their community.
- 10. Provided funds to purchase equipment for children with special medical needs or for children who are blind or deaf.
- 11. Participated in the Lions Clubs International Peace Poster Contest.
- 12. Participated and/or financially supported Project Pride.

The Letter must be received by the DISTRICT AWARDS CHAIRPERSON

by October 1

MD 37 HALL OF FAME NOMINATION CRITERIA

Any Lion, Lioness, Lions Club, Lioness Club, Zone or Region may nominate a candidate from their district to the MD 37 Hall of Fame.

- 13. There is no nomination fee.
- 14. There may be a maximum of one (1) candidate per district, inducted into the Hall of Fame each year.
- 15. The District Governor must receive nominations at least 30 days prior to the District's Annual convention. Each individual District will hold an election to determine the successful candidate.
- 16. The award may be presented to either a Lion or Lioness and only one recipient per District may be elected annually.
- 17. The award may be presented posthumously.
- 18. Each candidate must have 15 years of service and be two years removed from Council (if they have served as a member of the Council of Governors).
- 19. Each candidate should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavours. He/she should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in his/ her community.
- 20. All sponsors will use the standard form. No other will be accepted.
- 21. The sponsor(s) will ensure the candidate, or representative, will be in attendance at the Multiple District Convention.
- 22. All successful candidates will be inducted to the Hall of Fame at the next MD 37 Convention.
- 23. The presentation of the MD 37 Hall of Fame Awards is the responsibility of the MD 37 Historian.
- 24. A brief biography of each inductee shall be announced to the delegates attending the

annual MD 37 Convention, and published in the subsequent MD 37 Newsletter.

- 25. A perpetual plaque will be kept in a prominent place in the MD 37 Office.
- 26. The application for this award may be found on the MD37 website

DR. LYNN G. HALL LEADERSHIP AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING LEADERSHIP IN LIONISM

This Award was established in 1997 in recognition of the outstanding Leadership qualities in Lionism displayed by the late Lion Dr. Lynn G. Hall. Lion Lynn was a member of various clubs for over 50 years and also served as District Governor 1952-53 and 1975-76. Always quick to step forward, no matter what the project, Lion Lynn was a leader by example. He was an active participant in many a fundraiser and a great Lion. Lion Lynn exemplified what Lionism is all about. His professional life included teaching, School Superintendent, School Inspector, Provincial Director of School Administration as well as serving as Mayor of Lac La Biche and Councilor of Wainwright.

AWARD CRITERIA

- A Lion Member in good standing with a Lions club for a MINIMUM OF 10 years.
- A Lion who has demonstrated continuous leadership for a MINIMUM OF three (3) years.
- 3. A Lion whose leadership may be at the community, club, district or International level or a combination thereof.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

1. Application may be made by any Lion in good standing within district 37L.

- 2. A letter is to be written which includes the following:
 - Name of Award applied for
 - Name of the Lion
 - Name of the club
 - When the Lion became a member
 - Commitment to Lions based on the above criteria
 - Biography of applicant) marital status, family, interests, etc.)

The Letter must be received by the DISTRICT AWARDS CHAIRPERSON by October 1

HERB MOELLER UNSUNG HERO AWARD

This Award was established in memory of Lion Herb Moeller, a member of the Edmonton Northgate Lions club following his death in September 1999. Lion Herb was the club treasurer at the time of his death and worked tirelessly on behalf of the youth in our community. Lion Herb was quick to volunteer and serve on club projects and activities. He joined Lions in 1986.

AWARD CRITERIA

A Lion in good standing who has worked tirelessly behind the scenes to advance the causes of Lionism and their club.

A Lion who has volunteered regularly to serve on club committees, projects and fundraisers.

A Lion who may have worked on ZONE or DISTRICT PROJECTS.

A Lion who has not received, within the past three (3) years, a District Award, and International Presidents Certificate, or a District Governor Appreciation Award.

APPLICATION CRITERIA

1. Application may be made by any Lions Club in good standing within District 37L.

2. A letter written by the most recent Past Club President to include the following:

- Name of Award applied for
- Name of the Lion
- Name of the club

• When the Lion became a member Commitment to Lions based on the above criteria

Biography of applicant) marital status, family, interests, etc.).

The Awards Chair must receive nominations by <u>October 1</u> in order to be presented at the District's Annual convention.

How the Contest Works

Lions clubs sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2011. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "Children Know Peace."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of theme.

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

Awards

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows:

- International Grand Prize Winner receives a trip to the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations (subject to change). At the ceremony he/she will receive a cash award of US\$5,000 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony. The award ceremony is scheduled for March 2012.
- 23 Merit Award Winners each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.
