Multiple District 37 Redistricting

The Multiple District is considering proposals for re-districting to resolve the lack of membership in two districts. The committee charged with developing proposals came up with two scenarios which best address all concerns and opportunities. MD Council is now soliciting responses from the Districts so that a final proposal can be forwarded to the District Conventions in the next year for selection of a resolution and election by the Lions of the Multiple District. The proposals are:

Proposal 1+3: This proposal allows for one single district to be formed encompassing all the Lions Clubs in Montana, while the Canadian Clubs currently in MD 37 would re-organize into three sub-districts.

It would also permit a single District Governor's Team (Cabinet, been made of the pros and cons and a committee was struck to determine by 37N – mostly related to the quick movement of mail, conversion of dues, and travel. There is little or no opposition from Montana Lions regarding the committee presented two options at a unification of all their Clubs into a single district.

What is at issue is the redistricting of the Canadian Clubs into two or three Districts (perhaps forming a new Multiple District), with a new number or alphabetic designation.

The 1 (Montana) + 3 proposal would essentially divide the current Canadian Clubs of Canada into three Districts, with divisions based on an East-West line that runs just north of Calgary and a line that runs East-West based on Highway 13, which runs through Camrose and Wetaskiwin.

The 1 (Montana) + 2 Proposal creates a South District base on the 403 Area Code and a North District based on Area Codes 780, 250 (Chetwynd, Hudson Hope, Tumbler Ridge), and 867 (Yellowknife and Hay River. For reference, the dividing line between Area Codes 403 and 780 runs roughly E/W north of Red Deer.

In either case, current zones would be kept together – these boundaries are not set in stone, and Clubs having a historical affiliation for a current zone could apply to remain with that zone. This means Clubs located near a boundary will have a request to be part of a different District seriously considered by the appropriate District Governors.

Breaking News!

As a result of the Cabinet meeting on May 25, 2013 District 37L with input from clubs and the cabinet members, unanimously passed a motion for the preference of a 2 District system based on area codes 780 and 403. District Governor Elect Joan Lubbers will forward District L's preference to the MD Council meeting in July. (Just a note that when this information was passed onto the three club charter that same evening it was received with a rousing round of applause from all.)

Prior to the opening of the Brachytherapy Program as part of . the Ocular Oncology Clinic, patients with ocular tumors that could be treated with brachytherapy had to be accepted for treatment over 2,000 miles away in Philadelphia or pursue other treatment options -- which in the case of ocular cancer, often meant amputation of the eye."

Ocular Oncology sees about 1,500 patients every year -- both new and follow up.

To date we have raised \$46,400 towards our goal. We are submitting a grant request to LCIF for a matching grant of \$60,000. Together we can reach our goal and purchase much needed equipment.


