Dear Lions,

Did you know that up to **80 percent of global blindness is preventable?** Lions and LCIF are working hard to reduce that number and I am happy to say that we are making a difference.

An example of this is our efforts and partnerships aimed at eliminating onchocerciasis (**River Blindness**), a disease that can lead to blindness. Last month, **Lion President Madden** was able to join former **U.S. President and Lion Jimmy Carter** at a special celebration in Colombia. Through the work of LCIF and Lions, The Carter Center, the Colombian government and other dedicated people and organizations, Colombia became the **first of six countries in the Americas to <u>Eliminate River Blindness</u>. I am so proud of our role in this achievement.** 



It is through the <u>Sight First</u> program that LCIF helps Lions deliver services that target diseases such as **River Blindness**, **cataract and trachoma**; build or expand facilities; train professionals; and build awareness about eye health in underserved communities. LCIF also supports many services for the visually impaired, including education and rehabilitation. Just last week, LCIF's **Sight First** Advisory Committee approved **32 Sight First grants for a total of US\$7.5 million**. These projects will help Lions in Belize, the **United States**, Brazil, Nepal and other countries complete diverse sight-saving projects.

Lion President Madden was recently able to see a great example of a project in the United States at the Spectrios Institute for Low Vision in Illinois. There, dedicated staff and doctors help people with low vision obtain tools, technology, training and support. An LCIF grant helped expand a portion of the institute, and it was inspiring to hear the stories of the people who have been helped.

From helping a country eliminate a blinding disease to helping a person with reduced vision realize that they can still read, **you are making a difference**. And **LCIF is here to help you make that difference**.

### Generous Commitment to LCIF during Convention

In a **surprise announcement**, Board Appointee and Past District Governor Aruna Oswal and her husband, Lion Abhey Oswal, **committed US\$5 million to Lions Clubs International Foundation** on stage during the annual Lions Clubs International Convention.

"My husband has always supported me...he wanted to pledge something for society, for **humanitarian causes**. So he pledged US\$5 million to be spread globally," said **PDG Oswal of India.** "I feel this is the best Foundation. I have seen it working...I have felt it with my heart and soul. the success stories. Today, it was a very big deal for all of us. Let us try to **make this world a beautiful world and let us create a difference in society.**"


