PARTICIPANT AGREEMENT ON CAMP RULES

It is the goal of the Youth Outreach Committee that every participant has a fun and safe experience during the Youth Leadership Institute. To help ensure this, we are asking you to review the following rules and sign this contract to abide by them.

- I will stay on camp property at all times during the Youth Leadership Institute weekend.
- I will not intentionally injure or endanger myself or any other person either physically or emotionally.
- I will respect the environment, camp, camp property and personal property of others. I will not enter others cabins or touch anyone's property without permission. If I do not, my family will be liable for damages caused.
- I will not use foul or abusive language.
- I will not engage in any sexual contact, indecent exposure, or entering a cabin of opposite sex.
- I will not use or possess tobacco products, drugs, alcohol or weapons.
- I will demonstrate respect for staff, chaperones and fellow campers at all times.
- I will not engage in harassment or ethnic/racial/religious/political slander of any person or group.
- I will be on time for all activities and meals. I will participate in all scheduled activities. I will be in the right place at the right time doing the right thing.
- I will remain in my cabin during designated quiet hours. If I must leave the cabin for any reason during these hours (i.e. restroom), I will notify my chaperone.
- I will be quiet and courteous when instructions are being given.
- I will keep my cabin area neat and will ensure that I leave my space clean at the end of the weekend.
- I will not eat or store food in my cabin.
- If I am with someone who is breaking one of the above rules, I will talk with my chaperone or a Youth Outreach Committee member about it.

If I do not follow these rules, I

1. Can be promptly dismissed from camp.
2. Must have a parent/guardian come to camp to pick me up at their own expense.
3. Forfeit all camp fees.
4. Risk losing the privilege of returning to camp in the future.
