My fellow Lions:

This will be the last article of my First Vice District Governor year.

I have truly enjoyed serving my Lions family these past two years as your VDG. DG John Nelson and his cabinet officers have been a real pleasure to work with and be a part of. All of the club visitations, installations, Student Speaker Contests and other events I have attended are a pleasant memory as well.

I thank every member of District 4-L2 for their service and for supporting me these past two years. I am enjoying the journey that will now take me to the next level of leadership in our District.

As I prepare to be your next District Governor for the 2019-2020 Lions year, I must tell you about the training that is presented by Lions Clubs International. By the time I am officially installed in Milan, Italy, on July 9, 2019, I will have had four days of DG training. The first three days (February 11 – 15) were held at the Q Center in St. Charles, Illinois, about 35 miles from Chicago. I was there along with 754 other FVDG's from around the world.

During our time there we were treated to a bus trip to Chicago where we visited the grave site of our founder Melvin Jones and his wife, who is also interred there. From there we went to LCI headquarters in Oakbrook, Illinois, which is also a suburb of Chicago, for the grand tour of the facility that included the offices of the President and three Vice Presidents of LCI. The First Vice President, Jung-Yui Choy, was on hand and we all had our pictures taken with him.

Our Group Leader and Trainer was PID Allen Lundgren from Scottsdale, Arizona, and he made our time with him fun, memorable, and a wonderful learning experience. He will also be in Milan to present the fourth day of training that will be on July 5<sup>th</sup>, the day before the start of the International Convention.

Also, on February 5 – 7 was the mid-winter Council of Governors meeting in Sacramento, CA. It was held at the Double Tree Hotel and then the MD-4 (State) Annual Convention followed on the 8 – 10. The big event at the Convention was of course the election of our MD-4 Endorsed Candidate for International Director. Two candidates were in the running for the position, PCC David Radtke, District 4-L4, and PDG Ken Ibarra, District 4-C4. The voting was very close and PDG Ken was declared the winner by two (2) votes.

Lion Teri and I were honored to be the guests of FVDG Claudia Miller, at District 4-A1's District Meeting on February 22 – 23 in Sutter Creek, CA. We enjoyed a wonderful dinner on Friday evening at a restaurant owned by a Lion, with live music for entertainment and then breakfast and lunch on Saturday, prepared and served by the Lions of District 4-A1.

It's time to start setting dates for club officers' elections. The elections are to be held no later than April 15, 2019. Report the results on mylci or mailing a copy of the PU101 form to Lions Club International. Deadline for reporting 2019 – 2020 club officers is May 15, 2019.

District 4-L2 Convention will be held May 17 – 19, 2019 in Cathedral City (near Palm Springs). For a club delegate to be eligible to vote, a club must be in good standing. This means **both MD-4 dues and LCI dues must be paid by April 30, 2019.** Any club with a past due balance will not be able to vote.

Many questions have asked about how many delegates a club will have. This information comes from LCI and I should have the report by April 3<sup>rd</sup>. As soon as I receive the report, the Delegate Form and number of delegates for each club will be emailed to both the Club President and Club Secretary. Eligibility is based on membership as of March 31, 2018. A Lion must be a member for a year and one day to be able to vote.

## California Lions Foundation Will Soon Be Accepting Grant Requests

Your California Lions Foundation (CLF) is entering the next stage of its development as we will soon be accepting grant requests in the range of \$500-\$2,500. Let me share with you where we currently stand:

#### **Current Financial Status:**

- Non-designated charitable funds: \$210,000
- Designated charitable funds: \$34,000 (mostly for wildfire and disaster relief)
- Administrative funds: \$15,000.00

<u>Wildfire Relief</u> - During the course of the recent wildfires, most seriously in District C-1, CLF received \$114,000 in designated wildfire donations and disbursed \$80,000 in response to requests from District C-1.

<u>Soon CLF Will Be Accepting Grant Request Applications</u> – The CLF Board of directors has decided that it will soon accept grant requests of \$500-\$2,500. Keeping requests to this dollar range will extend the life of the currently available non-designated charitable funds. The grant policies and grant request forms will soon be posted on the CLF web site.

<u>CLF Needs Non-Designated Charitable Donations to Fulfill its Mission</u> – California Lions were generous in their response to the wildfires we suffered last year. What we really need now is a program of sustained giving to meet the many ongoing needs of our California communities. As clubs enter the time of year when they recognize their leaders, this is a wonderful time to consider a Kay K. Fukushima Fellow. There still is some room left for a Founding Member and Founding Club.

**Endowment** – Your CLF Board has decided to set aside as an endowment \$100,000 of the current non-designated charitable monies. To that will be added a percentage of all new non-designated donations. The income from these invested funds will be available for grants. The objective is to insure a future base from which income will be derived for new grants.

## Lions Day at the City of Hope March 31, 2019

It was a beautiful day to be at City of Hope. Approximately 350 Lions and guests attended the annual day, which started off with a panel discussion from the Diabetes and Metabolism Research Institute. We learned that diabetes impacts the lives of more than 422 million people worldwide. That's 1 in 11 adults or about 40 times the population of Los Angeles County. The Lions announced a new "Diabetes Campaign" which will raise one million dollars in five years for research.

Tours were then held and attendees heard about how children, who are fighting cancer, are made to feel more at ease in their various treatments. Tours of the Japanese and Rose Gardens were also enjoyed.

After lunch, we heard the story of living with cancer and being treated at the City of Hope by our own PDG Dennis Windscheffel (Monterey Park Lions Club).

Clubs and individuals then presented donations which totaled \$28,337. Those Clubs from our District that were honored for donations made previously and/or who made donations this year included: Los Angeles Chinese Lions, Montebello Lions, Norwalk Lions, East Valley Lions.

We are fortunate that the City of Hope is located in Duarte, Ca, which is part of our District.
