President Johnny Chang (Los Angeles Dynasty Lions) was able to use his company's truck to ship the pallets from the donors to another charity called Care-Mission who cook and have been providing dinner boxes to the homeless in downtown Los Angeles for longer than sixteen years. Lions volunteered to pack more than 240 dinner boxes for them.

Congratulations to the San Gabriel Region Club Presidents who are very active and organized in planning for the future. On December 20th eight club presidents and three chairpersons met at a restaurant in Rowland Heights to plan an event for Saturday, February 29, 2020. It will be a "Walk for Health", Walk Lions! Keep It Up! The time will be 9:00am-Noon at Whittier Narrows Recreation Park. This event will be publicized to all clubs in the District. A donation of \$1,600 has been pledged towards this event.


