A Message from District Governor Gary Hall



My Fellow Lions:

These first four months as your District Governor have been a great, exciting and wonderful experience for me. The District is doing well financially as attested to by the Budget/Financial Oversight Committee and with 48 clubs and 1300+members on the books, and one new club to be chartered soon and another to be chartered this Lions' year, we will add at least 40 more members to the count.

So far this year my Cabinet Officers and I have visited well over half of the Clubs in the District and at all of those visits we have been treated to fine food, friendship, respect and made to feel very welcome. While at these visits I have had the honor to induct many new members into Lions and install the club officers of many of our Clubs. I and Lion Teri have also had the pleasure of visiting other districts installation of officers and district meetings along with a Council of Governor's meeting in Redding.

This year, 2019-2020, there is a new "Focus Area" for pediatric and adolescent cancer patients that has been started in District 4-L2 by PDG Dennis Windscheffel (1995-96). While I was serving as DGE I was approached by PDG Dennis, with the possibility of my supporting the HERO Recognition Award Program. After listening to PDG Dennis explain his vision for this program I told him I would support it and that I would put District 4-L2 behind it as well. The program is to award a HERO medallion and certificate of recognition to children who are fighting or have fought the ravages of childhood cancer. The metal medallion, which will be worn around the neck on a bright yellow ribbon and be about 2 ½" in diameter has among other things, around the outer edge three things that exemplify what is needed from the patient and their families, beside medical treatment for cancer, "BE STRONG – HAVE COURAGE – NEVER GIVE UP".

When I do my official DG visit to the District's Clubs, I am speaking about this program and giving the Clubs an opportunity to participate. Clubs are asked to become a Sponsor Club with a donation of just \$200.00 which will purchase 20 or more of these medallions. All funds raised will be used for the administration of the HERO program. Special recognition will be awarded Sponsor Clubs in the form of a Banner Patch and other recognitions. Personal donations will also be recognized with a Certificate of Appreciation. At the upcoming District Meeting on Saturday, November 2, 2019, our special guest speaker will be PDG Dennis Windscheffel presenting the HERO program and presenting the certificates and banner patches to Sponsor Clubs and those that have donated personally.


