Angostura Distillery Tour & Butterfly Museum / Port of Spain City Tour / Maracas Bay – Cost to be determined (Delegate to fund)

Upon arrival at the House of Angostura Distiller, there will be a fascinating tram ride around the distillery and bottling plant to learn how rum and the world-famous Angostura Bitters is produced. You will also view the extensive and colourful collection of over 700 species of butterflies in the Butterfly Museum. The real treat comes at the end of the tour, with a special rum-tasting session and visit to the Gift Shop.

There will be a brief driving tour of the highlights of the capital city, viewing landmarks such as Cathedrals and the Queen's Park Savannah, a 200-acre park lined with colonial style mansions with amazing architectural design.

The final stop takes you to Trinidad's most famous beach, Maracas Bay, where you can take a dip in the water or stroll on the shore. Lunch, of course, will be the famous, "must-have" Bake & Shark, which constitutes a sandwich of golden fried shark fillets topped with spicy chutneys and sweet sauces.

Queen's Park Oval & Cricket Museum / Carnival Mas Camp

Visit the Queens Park Oval, an iconic cricket stadium that is recognized throughout the world. After touring the grounds and the historic oval pitch, you will receive a guided tour of the Cricket Museum. Located within the Brian Lara Pavilion, it contains photographs, exhibits, and artifacts featuring the cricket legacy of not only Trinidad but also the greater West Indies. See for yourself the three bats used by Brian Lara for his record breaking 375, 601, and 400 not out. This is truly a treat for any cricket fan.

Your next stop takes you to a "Mas Camp" to learn about the art of costume-making or "mas"-making for the famous Carnival festivities that take place in Trinidad each year. View the making of beautiful costumes and hear from the band-leaders themselves the theme behind their creations.

Tobago Day Tour (Post – Conference Tour)

A fifteen-minute plane ride away takes you to the beautiful and tranquil sister isle of Tobago. Your day kicks off with a tour of the Buccoo Reef and Nylon Pool. Hop aboard a glass-bottomed boat and take a short sail to the Buccoo Reef, where you can view the underwater coral treasures from the boat. There will also be a snorkeling opportunity to get up close and personal with the beautiful exotic fishes that inhabit the reef. You then journey to the Nylon Pool, a shallow, white-sand area just behind the reef – its crystal clear waters are rumoured to make you feel 10 years younger!

Back on the shore, enjoy a delicious local lunch at Renamar's Restaurant, located at the scenic Pigeon Point Beach Facility.

After lunch, you depart for an island tour, visiting sites such as Fort King George, where the breathtaking views and canons are reminiscent of the island's turbulent colonial history. Also visit the Mystery Tomb and attempt to solve its cryptic riddle.
