He has been an educational leader at the local, divisional, provincial and

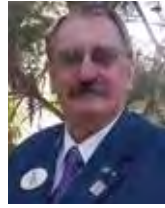

Elgin Lions recover lost cup at flea market

In 1932 "Frank" was a winner and he had the winners' cup to prove it until the cup was lost.

"Frank" was a Clydesdale and his owner was Wesley Gibson.

Gibson's horse "Frank" won many trophies as he came in first quite frequently, but unfortunately, over the years the cups were lost for one reason or another.

The Elgin and Area Lions found one of the silver trophy cups at a Souris flea market. As the description on the front was read, it was realized that the cup came from a local person and this cup should be in the museum. It read that this cup belonged to "Frank" a Clydesdale show horse that belonged to Wesley Gibson. The inscription read that "Frank" had placed 1st for the CBC trophy in 1932.

Wesley Gibson was the

only child of Thomas Elie & Myrtle Gibson. He was born and raised on the family farm at Underhill, Manitoba, near Hartney.

Gibson was extremely active in showing his Clydesdale. He travelled with them to the Toronto Royal fair, Chicago, Guelph Ontario and many of the different local places that held fairs. His three daughters and his wife must have been extremely proud of him and his

horses as he won so many first prizes.

The Clydesdale is a heavy workhorse, as many of you may already know, but did you know that it is the ultimate parade horse? They had to be, to pull the Budweiser wagon and win so many first prizes for Gibson. The heavy horse stood on the average about 16 to 20 hands high and weighed anywhere from 1600 to 2400 pounds. Imagine how much they could

eat! That ranged from 25 to 50 pounds of hay and 2 to 10 pounds of grain every day.

Well known for their white blazes and four white legs they were famous for the "feathers" on their hocks. The long silky hair accentuated the movements of the horse. They have a very gentle nature and temperament and are usually referred to as "Gentle Giants". Their hooves alone were the size of an average dinner plate; consequently a Ferrier was needed to be kept handy to keep those hooves healthy.

Journey begins in three locations with over 70 snowmobile riders

The journey this year began in three different locations in Manitoba with some 70 snowmobile riders made up of Lions and other snowmobile enthusiasts. A group began in Thompson; travelled to Snow Lake, Cranberry Portage, Flin Flon with a stay over in The Pas. They next travelled through various communities on their way to Swan River. At this point the group

split in two with one group heading for Dauphin while the other group went west towards Roblin. The Dauphin group continued down #10 while the other group came towards Brandon down #16 highway. Accommodations were prearranged with meals being provided by various community groups along the

way. New riders often joined the main contingent as they travelled through the various communities.

The second group travelled through communities including Waskada, Melita, Boissevain, Killarney, Pilot Mound, La Riviere, Somerset, Swan Lake, Holland, Cypress River and

then into Brandon.

A third group of some 30 riders began in Morden and travelled through various communities in the area. The riders in this area were able to travel on groomed trails whereas the other two areas had riders travelling mainly in the ditches.

Although the weather

was not always cooperative the distance travelled by some of the riders exceeded 1200 kilometers. The dedication of all these riders must be commended as they endured the challenges of each day. Not one complaint was heard, as all love the adventure of the trip and also the opportunity to contribute to a very worthy cause in this fine province of ours.

The Brandon Wheat City Lions under the direction of Lion Murray Tallant and Dawn organized the celebration and meal. Fellow Lion Doug Smallwood and Sue, Lions Paul and Red Huska, Lion Dave Sparks and Verna and Lions Bev and Lloyd McCabe assisted him. Fellow Lions Keith Privat, Glenn Rogers and Carl Wlock from the Keystone Lions as well as Lion Larry Minnie from the Brandon Club also helped out.

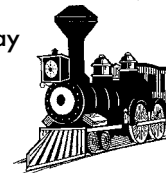
