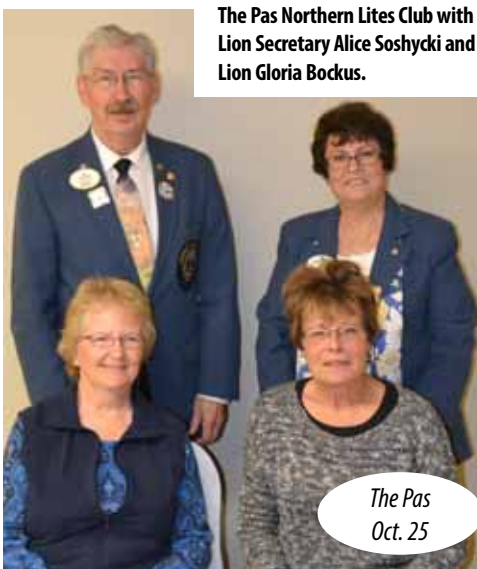

LCIF funds required for Disaster Relief

The disastrous Super Typhoon Haijan in the Philippines has resulted in thousands of deaths, lost homes

and general destruction. LCIF has provided \$US 130,000 from our Disaster Relief Fund and OSEAL (Orient South East Asia Lions) have donated

\$US 370,000. The Canadian Government has provided twenty million, will match donations, and has sent the Forces "Disaster Assistance Response Team"

(DART) to the area to assist with basic medical care, safe drinking water, repair basic infrastructure and improve communications.

Lions are encouraged to donate to LCIF in order to provide funding for such disasters and other forms of assistance. Disaster donations are eligible for Melvin Jones Fellowships. LCIF donations are required to qualify for the Club Excellence Award.

Another disastrous storm brought ruin to parts of Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio and into Ontario. These areas will require additional financial support. Your help would be appreciated and remember LCIF when allocating funds for our Mid-Winter Convention's "Parade of Green".

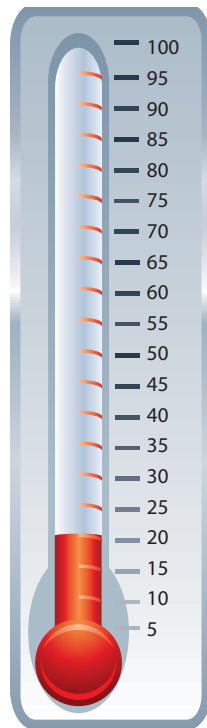

For teachers workshop training is a must. Lions Quest believes that the most effective way to implement positive youth development programs is to equip educators with current research, materials, and strategies for addressing critical issues facing youth. Our one and two day workshops are conducted by LIONS QUEST TRAINERS who represent the highest standards of professionalism.

Educators certified at Lions Quest workshops receive grade-specific resource kits. This material is "teacher friendly" written for teachers by teachers and is approved by Education Departments in every Canadian Province.

Parents are treated as partners in education and Lions Quest resources are designed

with this key component in mind. Lions Quest teachers and parents meet during the school year and several homework assignments are aided by parents.
