

WHEREAS the use of the internet has become a valuable source of information; and
WHEREAS communication using e-mail, club Web sites, social networking sites and e-newsletters allow

for club business, member information and public club promotion to be done;

THEREFORE
BE IT RESOLVED that _____ Lions Club may transact business via the internet, provided that no such action shall be effective until approved in writing by the majority of the members of the club, but votes thereon to be valid, must be received by the secretary within ten days of the original e-mail.

2014 LIONS DISTRICT 5M13 SPEAK-OFF COMPETITION RULES

- co-educational contest available at three levels:
 - Middle Years (Grade 6-8)
 - Senior 1&2 (Grade 9&10)
 - Senior 3&4 (Grade 11&12)
- participants must be attending a Manitoba Department of Education sanctioned school
- speeches of 4-6 minutes; 5 point deduction for each half minute or portion thereof to be assessed
- contestants may use notes (excessive reading to be penalized)
- speeches must be original on a topic of speaker's choice
- at end of speech, two questioners will pose questions to the contestant
- order of speaking will be by assigned numbers drawn prior to contest
- speeches will be evaluated in four categories:
 1. Delivery
 2. Material
 3. Response to questions
 4. Language & grammar.
- Each of the following will be scored out of a possible 10 points: voice/modulation; enunciation; pace; poise/confidence; organization; clarity of message; speaker's passion for topic; grammar/language; response to questions adequate & logical and made in a clear & fluent manner.

The family of the deceased will receive an "In Memoriam" card stating that a tree has been planted in memory of their loved one.

Recognition will take place at an annual dedication ceremony on the 2nd Saturday of June. Order deadline is May 9, 2014 for the June 14, 2014 Dedication Service.

to Lions. Anyone may purchase a tree.

The Pet Memorial Wall is located in Breslau, Ontario, on the grounds of the Dog Guide training centre, where many of our puppies begin their lives. Each plaque costs \$150.00 CAD.







a) Encouraging Lions to be both knowledgeable of and a supporting part of Lions clubs International (LCI);

b) Encourage the District to provide positive contributions at the

Multiple District level; and
c) Further the interests of Lionism in District 5M-13 by identifying areas of concern and providing recommendations – the basic purpose of the Past District Governors' Association."
