The Tree Project for 5M3

The multiple would like to see all the districts do this service project this spring. Each district would plant 500 trees and that would be about 14 trees per club and there are thirty-five clubs in the district. We hope that all the Lions Club in the district will to this service project. Let's help International President Patti Hill meet her goal of tree planting. It is the 5M3 District goal to have a least 75% of the clubs plant trees in the months of May and June.

500 silver maples have been ordered with a cost of about \$375 dollars with shipping extra. Hopefully they arrive in May. DG Patty Peterson has offered to receive the trees. Delivery of the trees to the clubs will then fall on the zone chairs. They will be in charge of getting the trees to the clubs in their zone. If the clubs don't pick up the trees, the zone chair could make a trip to deliver on a certain day and time. We are new at this service project and any ideas would help.

The Lions Clubs of 5M3 will need to come forward and get the trees. It's up to the clubs where to plant and care for the trees after they are planted.

More details on the tree project will be discussed at the cabinet meeting on Thursday, March 21. Also, on March 26 at the Tracy zone meeting at the Caboose, all members and clubs are invited to attend. The lions newsletter will have more information.

Light brown, strong, fairly hard, even-textured, rather brittle, easily worked, decays readily when exposed to weather or soil; occasionally used for flooring, furniture, and fuel; often mixed with red maple for commercial purposes; extensively planted as a shade and ornamental tree.
