WHICH AWARD CAN YOU GIVE? Contact your 5M3 District Chairman to obtain your clubs donation status to District Charities so you can honor a club member.

Hall of Fame Award– Each District can award 1 per year. An application has be submitted to the DG in advance of the convention and is voted on at the business meeting. The winner is announced and awarded at the MD5M Convention in Rochester. Do you have a member who qualifies for this award? If so, go to our 5M3 website– Forms. Submit them before February 1, 2016 to DG Steve

Al Jensen Award– This is an MD5M award that is given at the MD5M Multiple Convention in Mankato on April 22nd. Only 2 are given in the Minnesota, Manitoba & NW Ontario area. Criteria for this award is listed at the 5M3 website under Forms.

MD5M Diabetes Dream Catcher Award– An accumulative donation of \$1,000 to the Diabetes Foundation or Camp Needlepoint or any other donation related to Diabetes will merit qualifications for an award. You need to track your own club activity in this area and notify Lion Mary Snobl at <u>marysnobl@llwb.coop</u>(507-629-4734) OR Lion Bob Schirlinger at <u>bbschir@comcast.net</u>(507-354-8940) to acquire the award.

Melvin Jones Fellowships– highest award that can be received by a Lion is the Melvin Jones Fellow (MJF). It was established in 1973 as a means to provide funds to Lions Clubs International (LCI) and also to establish the highest form of recognition for dedication and humanitarian service. Today, the MJF provide 70% of the funds provided for the LCI humanitarian programs such as relief to victims of earthquakes, tornados, hurricanes, etc. The fellowship is obtained for US \$1000. and may be given to men or women , not necessarily Lions, in recognition for their service. The recipient receives an inscribed plaque and lapel pin. Financing needs to be completed within a five year period with a minimum of \$100 in any one year. For those who have a MJF, a Progressive MJF (PMJF) is available for each additional \$1000 with the recipient receiving a lapel pin with a "level" gemstone. This award can be presented at a club meeting or at our 5M3 Mid Winter Convention. Lions MD5M Hearing Foundation Award– The MD5M Hearing Foundation gives the Fellowship award for \$1,000. This can be an accumulative donation to achieve the \$1,000 goal. Contact PDG Wayne Radloff at Wayne.Radloff@yahoo.com (507-865-4732) OR Lion Cindy LaBrie at cynl@outlook.com (507-637-8267).

Leader Dogs Founders Tribute– This program allows clubs to honor an individual club member or event sponsor for his or her consummate service, dedication and commitment to Lionism and Leader Dogs for the Blind. The Founders tribute is available in three levels: Bronze- \$500; Silver- \$1,000; Gold- \$2,500. The award recipient is given a custom engraved Leader Dog Founders Tribute plaque and a commemorative Founders Tribute pin and patch. The plaques, pins and patches are tailored for each level. Helen Keller Award– are given to honor those who have distinguished themselves within your Lions Club for outstanding commitment or service to your club or community. This is an excellent way to honor a Lion, Lioness, non-Lion individual, business, or organization. A \$1,000 donation to the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation (for the MN Lions Eye Bank, Lions Children's Eye Clinic, the MAC Center, the Fund to Prevent Blindness in Infants and Children, or other Vision Foundation projects) allows the donor to present a Helen Keller Award. The award recipient receives a beautiful plaque and pin, and the recipient's name is displayed on the Helen Keller board in the University of Minnesota Eye Clinic. Both the donor and the recipient have the satisfaction of supporting worthwhile Lions projects. Established in 1992, more the 2000 Helen Keller Awards have now been bestowed on deserving recipients. Project New Hope– Awards to individuals and clubs is a thank you for your generosity and caring for our veterans and their families. The awards look much like a military ribbon that would be worn on a uniform. Most have put them on club vests or jackets. We also have a PNH pin for a donation of \$25. Thanksgiving for Vision

Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation

On Saturday, October 31 Lions of Minnesota gathered to hear reports from the Doctors at the University of Minnesota. They told us of their work, their research and their treatment of vision problems of their patients. This ranged from blindness to cancer in the eyes, to corneal transplants to ongoing investigations of vision. We heard and saw results of the Argus II and this has enabled 4 blind Minnesotans to experience limited sight. Some of the pictures and videos were graphic but revealing. Hearing from those benefiting from a Doctor's expertise is encouraging and remarkable.

At noon we enjoyed getting to know fellow Lions as we ate our excellent lunches. After lunch we were treated to stories about vision success efforts. A woman and a man, now married, who each had lost their first spouse, met and told their stories about spouse donation of eyes. A young girl, blinded in one eye by an accident, told her story of recovery and coping with the loss of an eye as she matured into a confident young lady.

Included in this article are two pages from the Vision Booklet that tells of the various programs of the Lions Vision Foundation. Note especially the section on the Minnesota Lions Surgery Center. We have pledged to raise \$4 million to fund the Surgery Center. This will save time for the Doctors who now have to travel to another site to perform eye surgery.

Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation

The Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation has worked to help the blind and visually-impaired since 1960. Through support of the Minnesota Lions Eye Bank, collaboration with the University of Minnesota's Department of Ophthalmology and Visual Neurosciences, and work collecting and distributing used eyeglasses, the Vision Foundation helps people throughout Minnesota and the world.

Minnesota Lions Eye Bank

The Minnesota Lions Eye Bank helps restore sight by providing corneas for transplant and eye tissue for research and medical education. In 55 years of operation, the Minnesota Lions Eye Bank has distributed more than 29,000 corneas for transplant and 28,000 eyes for research and education. Staff members work around the clock to offer people the option of eye donation.

Lions Children's Eye Clinic

More than 8,000 children are treated every year at the Lions Children's Eye Clinic. With four pediatric ophthalmologists, the clinic is one of the largest and beststaffed of its kind in the country. The dedication pediatric team strives to give each child the best chance for a lifetime of sight.

Lions donations helped equip the clinic at its present location in the Park Plaza Building in Minneapolis. Funds have also been devoted to study gliomas (eye tumors that affect children under the age of 10 and retinoblastoma (eye cancer typically striking children 3 and under). Long-time support by the Lions ensures the advancement of eye research, education, and patient care for our children and grandchildren.

Lions Macular Degeneration Center

The Macular Degeneration Center studies and treats macular degeneration, the leading cause of blindness in the United States. "MAC" doctors provide the best possible clinical care for individuals with macular degeneration or other retinal diseases and educate tomorrow's patient diseases and educate tomorrow's patient care providers. "MAC" researchers study the biology of aging and work toward a cure for macular degeneration. Equipment purchased by Lions allows doctors to gather remarkablydetailed information on a patient's retina, enabling better treatment and outcomes.

Lions-Funded Research: Tomorrow's Hope

New medications, improved surgical techniques, progress in the treatment and cure of diseases—all of these advances rely on research. Fortunately, the Lions have been generous and far-sighted in their support of ophthalmology research. In 1993, they gave \$3 million to help build the Lions Research Building on the U of M Minneapolis campus. The state-of-the-art laboratory building provides nearly 12,000 square feet of research space that includes services for an optic nerve rescue lab, a corneal dystrophy lab, and three labs working on aspects of macular degeneration. The Lion of Minnesota continue to support research, knowing that research is key to ending blindness.

Minnesota Lions Surgery Center

With the aging of our population, demand for the medical and surgical expertise of ophthalmologists will increase more than 33% in the next five years. Innovative new treatments now under development are also increasing the demand for specialized eve surgery. So in July of this year, the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation pledged \$4 million to fund the Minnesota Lions Eye Surgery Center. Patients will greatly benefit from the improved service at this specialized surgery center and will once again owe a debt of thanks to the Minnesota Lions.
