Global Membership Report

Happy New Year to all Lions of 5M3. I hope that you all had a safe and happy holiday season with your families and friends. Always a very busy time of the year. But here we are starting a new year and time to make some changes to increase our membership in our district. So, with that in mind, let's look at where we are at as of today (12/19/2023). First, membership in LCI stands at 1.38 million members around the world. That's a 40,928 member YTD increase or 2.96% growth. MD5M membership, again as of today, is 17,440 members. That is a plus 3 membership growth YTD. Now for 5M3. Year to date as of today we have 1020 members. During the month of December, we had 43 drops and 39 additions for a -4 YTD growth (and we still have 12 days left this month). Unfortunately, that is the wrong direction that we want to be heading. December and June are two of the months where we have the largest drops. We need to encourage our club members to continue to recruit and ask others to help us in our service. Our clubs are doing some great things in our communities, and we need to continue these projects. But we need to make sure our communities know what we do for them. Make some noise and get your service projects and photos in the papers or on the radio. We do not want to be the "best kept secret" in our communities. I hope all clubs look at strengthening your membership by hosting a new member night or some appreciation supper or some getting to know your Lions Club event. Spread the good news about what we do. Wishing you all the best in 2024 as you work to make your club and activities a success. Then make sure you celebrate your successes. Till next time, keep asking.

Proposed change to 5M3 Constitution and Bylaws To be voted on Feb 17, 2024 at Midwinter Convention

Current 5M3 reading is: Bylaws Article II, Section 7 Region/Zone Chairperson Qualifications.

Each region and zone chairperson shall:

a) Be an active member in good standing in his/her respective region or zone: and

b) Have served or will have served at the time of taking office as region or Zone chairperson as President of a Lions club for a full tem or major portion thereof, and a member of the board of director of a Lions club for no less than two (2) additional years.

After discussion at the Cabinet meeting, it was decided to change Section 7 as follows:

Bylaws Article II, Section 7 Region/Zone Chairperson Qualifications.

Each region and zone chairperson shall:

a) Be an active member in good standing in his/her respective region or zone: and

b) Be willing to serve in this role

Though not a requirement, previous experience as a Club President and (2) or more years of experience on the Board of Directors of a club would be recommended.

Justification: Current LCI Constitution and Bylaws has a note 12 in the section that states:

A district may change the qualifications to be more or less than what is stated here. In addition, 5M3 for many years has allowed people to serve as Zone Chair without having previously served as a Club President. It is time that we update the Bylaws to reflect what we are actually doing.

Maria T. Cunning from Phoenix, Arizona, USA, was elected to serve a two-year term as an international director of Lions Clubs International at the association's 105th International Convention in Boston, Massachusetts, USA, July 7 through July 11, 2023.

Director Cunning is a business owner and entrepreneur with more than 35 years of experience in real estate development. She currently manages and operates three companies. She is president and CEO of Arista Development, Inc., she is the owner and a designated broker for Altair Realty, LLC and she is the owner of Arizona Discount Flooring, LLC. Among her many notable projects are the construction of over 100 custom homes and a 120-unit apartment complex in the Phoenix and Scottsdale areas. She speaks 3 languages—English, Filipino and Spanish.

She is a third generation Lion with a passion for service and going on medical missions. She joined the Phoenix Barangay Lions Club as a charter member in 1996 and has served with them ever since. Additionally, she has served as guiding Lion for two clubs in the Phoenix area.

Director Cunning has held a number of offices within the association including district Youth Exchange chairperson and multiple district youth coordinator. She has served several years as multiple district membership chair and is currently the district 21-N membership chair She has served multiple times as LCI Tel-a-thon fundraising chairperson and has been a speaker at the USA-Canada leadership forum and for LCIF Foundation Fridays. She was also a task force member for the North American Membership Initiative. Additionally, she participates in the Global Service Missions and "A Ball for All" initiative for sight impaired children.

In recognition of her service to the association, she has received numerous awards including an International President's Award and an International President's Leadership Award. She is also a LCIF Progressive Lead Donor and a LCIF Legacy Society member.

In addition to her Lions activities, Director Cunning is active in numerous professional and community organizations. She is currently the national president for the Federation of Philippine American Chambers of Commerce (FPACC), president of the Filipino American Business Chamber of Commerce of Arizona, Board of Trustees for the National Federation of Filipino American Associations and is director at-large for the Arizona Asian American Association.

Director Cunning has received a number of civic awards for her kindness and service including Outstanding Asian American Citizen awarded by former US Senator Jon Kyl, the International Global Leadership Excellence Award, as well as the Excellence in Community Leadership award given by Filipino American National Historical Society. She was also honored as Woman of the Year in 2017 for Chicago by the TV Hall of Fame Awards.

Appendix 28.0 MD5M HALL OF FAME Procedure

Purpose

To honor those Lion and Lioness members of character and substance who have demonstrated the highest level of commitment and dedication to the efforts of their club, district or multiple district and the motto of our association, "We Serve."

Award

There shall be a maximum of one (1) recipient of the MD5M Hall of Fame Award per district, inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame each year. The award may be presented posthumously.

The MD5M Hall of Fame award recipients are to be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention during the Saturday noon luncheon.

MD5M Hall of Fame recipients shall receive a MD5M Hall of Fame award plaque and a Hall of Fame lapel pin in recognition of their induction in the MD5M Hall of Fame. In addition, a complete listing of all MD5M Hall of Fame recipients shall appear in the annual MD5M directory and a perpetual plaque, with the names of all inductees and the year of their induction inscribed thereon, shall be kept in a prominent place in the MD5M office, when available.

The presentation of the MD5M Hall of Fame inductees shall be the responsibility of the current International Director from MD5M, if there is one and he/she is in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention. If not, then the most recent Past International Director having served from MD5M in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

Criteria

A candidate may be a Lion or Lioness, must have been a member in good standing for at least 15 years, be at least two (2) years removed from the Council of Governors if a PDG, should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavors, and he/she should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in his/her community. A nominee must be a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club, or must have been a member in good standing of a Lioness Club at the time of their death.

Process

A candidate may be sponsored by any Lion, Lioness, Lions Club, Lioness Club, Zone, or District.

There shall be a nomination fee of \$150.00 per each candidate nominated. The nomination fee shall be returned to those sponsors whose candidates are not elected for induction into the MD5M Hall of Fame. The nomination fee for those selected for induction shall be sent to MD5M and shall be used to offset the cost of the award process, plaques and pin.

Nominations, including the nomination fee, must be received by the District Governor at least 30 days prior to the District's Midwinter Convention.

Each individual District shall annually hold an election at their Midwinter Convention to determine the candidate(s), if any, to be inducted into the Hall of Fame for that Lion Year. Each sponsor shall have an opportunity to give a brief presentation on the merits and biographical information of their nominee prior to the election. Those elected to be inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame shall not be publicly announced until their induction at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

All nominations shall use the standard form, no others shall be accepted. The nomination fee must be received at the time the application is received, otherwise the nomination shall not be considered.

All successful candidates shall be inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame at the next MD5M Multiple District Convention. The sponsor(s) and the respective District Governor shall ensure that the honoree or a suitable representative shall be in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention Saturday Luncheon when the honorees are inducted.

A brief biography of each inductee shall be announced to those in attendance during the induction ceremony at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention.

Be sure to fill out **ALL** the forms neatly and correctly which includes the 4 essay questions (in 350 words or less) and the question about scholarships that you have been offered along with submitting a **certified** copy of your high school transcript including activities. Plus you also need to attach recommendations from 2 persons (i.e. teacher, coach, clergy, employer, etc.) **AND** attach a recommendation letter from a Lions Club member indicating the name of the Club and state/province and country in which the Club is located.

A little information on some of the Foundations/Programs that District 5M3 supports. Parade of Green by VDG Deb Rasset

Camp Confidence: (501c3) It is an outdoor center for persons with developmental disabilities. The program is aimed at promoting self-confidence, self-esteem and the necessary skills to become contributing members of society.

Can Do Canines: (501c3) Raises and trains mobility dogs. The dogs are trained for Autism, Diabetes, Hearing, Mobility and Seizure Assistance. The dogs are provided at no charge to the recipient. For every \$1,000 donated your Club may present a 'Top Dog' award.

Childhood Cancer: (501c3) Provide services and resources for the support of childhood cancer patients and their families. Support research by providing funds to U of M Masonic Children's Hospital and other organizations that engage in research and treatment of childhood cancer. Clubs can receive \$500 matching grants for a family dealing with childhood cancer in their district. The Believe Award recognizes Clubs/individuals who have donated \$1,000.

Kidsight: (501c3) A program to screen the vision of children, primarily between the ages of 6 months to 6 years. About 7%-15 % screened children will be referred for a professional follow-up exam. For every \$1,000 donated your club may present a Sight Saver Award.

LCIF (Lions Clubs International Foundation): (501c3) Their mission is to empower Lions clubs, volunteers and partners to improve health and well being, strengthen communities, and support those in need through humanitarian services and grants that impact lives globally, and encourage peace and international understanding. For every \$1,000 donated a Melvin Jones Fellow Award may be presented.

Leader Dogs for the Blind: (501c3) Trains dogs for blind or visually impaired. The recipient may receive white cane training. Or their dog and training at no personal cost.

MN Lions Hearing Foundation: (501c3) Promotes advance of research and programs concerned with hearing health and communication disorders. They collect used hearing aids and have an affordable hearing aid program. For every \$1,000 donated your club may present a Hearing Research Fellowship. MN Lions Diabetes Foundation: (501c3) Dedicated to improving the quality of life for people with diabetes. Funds research towards the cure, provide education and sponsor preventive health activities. For every \$1,000 donated your club may present a Dream Catcher Award.

MN Lions Vision Foundation: (501c3) Works to help the blind and visually impaired. Through their support of Lions Gift of Sight, their collaboration with the U of M Department of Ophthalmology and collecting and distributing used eyeglasses. The Foundation helps countless people every day. For every \$1,000 donated your club may present a Helen Keller Award.

Project New Hope Lions Foundation of MN: (501c3) Provides family retreats for veterans and their families with educational skills to manage their lives after wartime service. They provide these activities totally free to the veterans and their families.

Quest/Youth Outreach/Peace Poster: This is for our district Quest, Youth Outreach and Peace Poster

True Friends: (501c3) Includes the following Camps - Camp Courage, Camp Courage North, Camp Eden Wood and Camp Friendship

Youth Exchange- Lions International/Youth Exchange Camp Spicer: Provides the opportunity for youth to learn about people and cultures other than their own to promote peace. Young people are given the opportunity of living with host families in a foreign country for a few weeks. To experience a new culture, history and different way of life.

TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation: (501c3) Formed to provide matching grants for MD5M Club projects that are too large for the club to do by itself, but too small for a LCIF grant. The Foundation hopes to begin awarding grants by July 2024.
