Hello Lions of 5M3. It is with mixed emotions as I write this last column for the newsletter. Seems like a long time ago (Mid-Winter Convention 2022) that I accepted the appointment to be the District Governor for 5M3 again. Now it's ending. I'm not sure if many of you understand how much FUN it is to be a District Governor. Yes, there are meetings, but the club visits and meeting club members is one of the great benefit of being the DG. Along with this is the educational benefit of learning about what Lions and Lionism is all about. Why am I telling you this? We still need a 2VDG to step up for our District. I think a lot of people are sitting on their hands because they don't understand what this process is all about. It's a great learning experience that you won't be disappointed in and I'm betting you will be happy and excited that you stepped up to serve.

Now a couple of things that need your attention. This means the club officers in 5M3. First, club officers training in June. This is for all officers (Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurers, and zone chairs). We are offering two different times at two different locations. Choose the one that works best for you. Dates and times are published in this edition of the newsletter. Last year we had about 25 percent of the officer's attend. Patty's goal is for 50 percent this year.

Next, (again club officers this means you) the Council of Governors at the last COG meeting passed a revised Privacy Policy. This will go into effect 7/1/2023. It is an "opt out" policy. Sometime soon you will be getting information explaining how this will work and club members will get the opportunity to "opt out" if they so desire. Personally, I don't understand why any Lion would want to do this. If you have any questions, please contact me or DGE Patty. Club officers keep watching for this as it will have a drop-dead date for completion. If you attended your zone meeting, you would know about this. Maybe another good reason to attend.

Lastly, (again Club officers) the Club Excellence Award can be completed and sent to DGE Patty starting July 1st, 2023. The deadline for completion is August 31st, 2023, so this has a short fuse too. Why, because it's tied to the yearly membership figures for your club, and you won't have those numbers until sometime in July. Requirements and application are found on the LCI website, search for Club Excellence Award and you'll find it.

OK, I'll quit picking on the club officers. This next item belongs to every Lion in 5M3. Most of you probably didn't realize that we did not have any nominations for "Hall of Fame" award this year. At the MD5M convention they presented 11 awards, one in each district except for 5M3. Remember, we didn't have any nominations. We dropped the ball on this one. Any member in 5M3, any club, any zone, or the district can nominate someone for the "Hall of Fame". First, they must be a member for at least 15 years (which probably represents about half of our membership), then they must be a member in good standing, represent the clubs and Lions organization well and are active in-service work in the club and community. I remember years ago, we had as many as three nominations at each Mid-Winter convention. It's too late this year, but we can do a better job next year. Remember, nominations must be in 30 days prior to the Mid-Winter convention, so the drop-dead date is approximately the 15th of January 2024.

The current membership is down 10 members YTD. If you have folks who are thinking of joining, get those in yet this year. Thanks to all the clubs that have been reporting their club service. We are at 80% of the clubs reporting (28 of 35). Congratulations to our GST person, PDG Dave Janssen who is doing an excellent job. Just found out tonight that we have met the contribution goal for LCIF this year, which was \$13,800. Good Job to our LCIF coordinator, IPDG Gordon Mulder, another job well done.

By the time you read this we will have delivered over 300 blankets and over 200 pillowcases to the Children's hospital in Sioux Falls. They are always excited to get them and a BIG THANK YOU to all the clubs for their donations, support, and help with tying and sewing. It couldn't have been done without your help. DGE Patty and 1VDGE Deb have plans for a new and exciting District project which they will be announcing shortly. Stay tuned.

I won't mention names as I will forget someone but thank you to all who helped make this year the special year it was. We have a lot of unsung heroes in our district who when asked have stepped up to help. Keep this up. Your help and service was appreciated, and it made my job easier. Again, thank you. Please continue to step up and support DGE Patty as she begins her journey as District Governor for 5M3. It's been a fun year, a busy year, but one that has been rewarding and I'm thankful that I had the opportunity to serve you again.
