District 5M2 would like to invite you to the 2021 MD5M Convention "Bend in the River III - Join the Jamboree" on May 1, 2021 for a one-day virtual convention. REGISTRATION IS FREE!!! Register today via online registration on the MD5M website lionsmd5m.org. An in-depth letter explaining the convention changes was sent to all club Presidents and Secretaries in the Multiple with email addresses. If either your club president or secretary did not receive a copy of the letter, please contact your District Governor or convention@lionsmd5m.org. As the convention nears, there will be links available to access Zoom and Facebook live for convention participation. This is an exciting year for the 2021 convention that will give the opportunity for all of you to "Join the Jamboree!" business meeting with online voting.

Candidate PDG Joanne Ogden of EMO, ON won the election to become an ID candidate. The next step is to get on the ballot at the International Convention and get the ENDORSEMENT of MD5M AT THE MULTIPLE CONVENTION April 30/May1, 2021. Canadian candidates from MD5M are elected to Constitutional Areas II. USA Candidates are elected to Constitutional Area I.

2021 Lions Clubs International Convention will be a virtual Event June 25 - June 29. Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (Covid-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Club International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. Details will be coming in the next newsletter.

The 45th Annual USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum is September 9 - 11 in Des Moines Iowa. It will offer a unique style as we move forward in our endeavor to create better leaders and educate you on building leadership within your multiple, district and club membership. We will feature over 70 seminars in 2 and 1/2 days that will give insight and guidelines to develop your growth as a leader in Winning Ways.

We are looking for Lions from your district to attend the 2021 MD5M Regional Lions Leadership Institute! It will take place at the Holiday Inn Detroit Lakes. RLLI is happening on October 21-24 2021. Lions that are selected as participants in the Institute must be in good standing in a Lions Club and may not be a 1st Vice District Governor, District Governor, Past District Governor, International Director, or Past International Director. Each district has the opportunity to send six (6) participants; however, if other districts do not meet their allotment, your district may send additional Lions. The Institute will have a maximum of 72 participants.

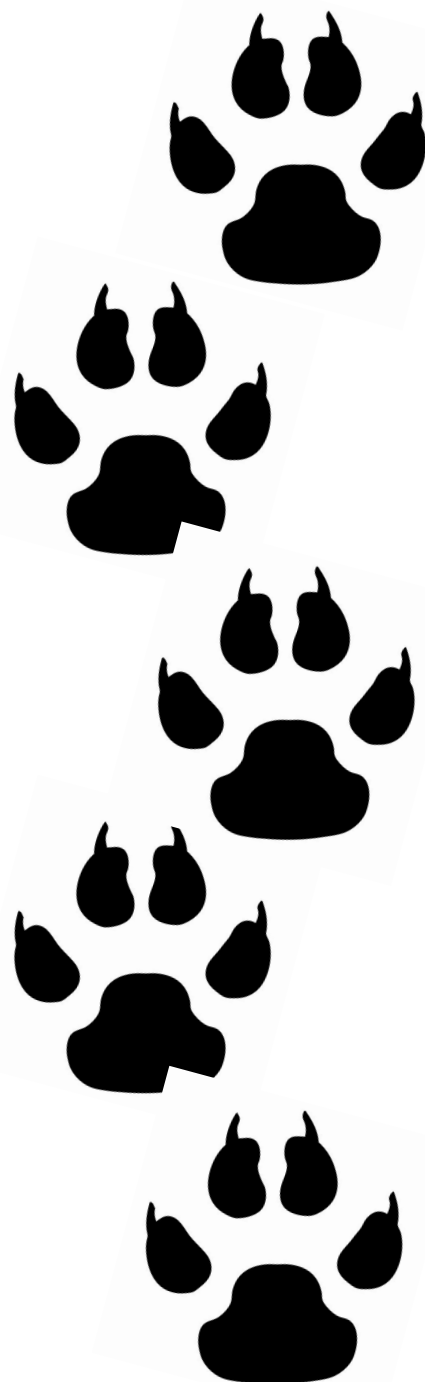

## Jetson's Assistance Is Like Pennies from Heaven for Karley

Mobility Assist Dog Jetson was trained to be helpful in many ways. He's a "coat tugger," "laundry loader," "drawer puller," "refrigerator opener," and "door plate pusher." And for his new partner, Karley, he may also be considered a "penny pincher."

Karley was born with what is called Ankyriosis Multiplex Congenita, which, she explains, "basically means my joints are stuck in a fixed position and some muscles never developed." She lacks bicep muscles, as well as some leg muscles, and her lower extremities cannot bear weight. Her elbows and wrists are bent and rotated at permanent, locked angles. So far holding most items and writing, Karley uses her right hand, and she relies on her left hand for feeding herself and as a "helper hand."

Now Karley also has "helper paws," courtesy of Jetson.

Not long after the two were paired together this summer, Karley brought Jetson with to a store. While shopping, she dropped some cash on the floor. "There was no one around," explains Karley. "If he wasn't with me, I would have had to either leave it and go try to find someone and hope that it would be there when I got back, or take that loss." But Jetson wasn't at a loss for what to do. He saved the money off the floor and deposited it all in Karley's hand, showing that he can literally be a "penny pincher."



### Time Is Money

Jetson also saves Karley from needing a personal care assistant as much, since he eagerly helps her herself throughout the day and night. "I'm definitely more independent," says Karley, who is glad she was introduced to Can Do Canines through her neighbors who have a dog of their own from the organization. Thinking back to her first moments with Jetson, Karley says, "We bonded right away and were in tune with each other very fast. He's such a happy dog and was ready to work instantly."

And Karley has plenty of work for Jetson to do. At age 21, she is a senior at Southwest Minnesota State University in Marshall, studying social work in order to focus on substance abuse treatment. She plans to do clinicals during the second semester in the Marshall area with Jetson being with her. Also, living in an apartment on her own on campus, Karley knows that Jetson will be critical to being able to do so safely.

### Giving Her the Correct Change

While she originally began considering an assistance dog when she was moving away to college a few years ago, Karley wasn't ready for all of that change at once. Now that she has Jetson, she says, "I think everything is going to go a lot smoother. I'm more confident going into classes and being able to do more." She's not the only one with added comfort. She sensed her mom's relief when dropping off Karley for the school year. "It usually takes a lot of effort to get her to leave campus. It was a lot easier for her."

One thing Karley wants to offer those who helped make her match with Jetson possible is a "huge thank you." With tearful emotion, she shares, "It's changed my life completely. Know that it really does make a world of difference."

You can bet your bottom dollar that this is one partnership that is "right on the money."

Membership problems, who has them? Is it just a local club problem, 5M3, or MD5M. No good news here, we recruit fewer new members than we retain. Cannot do much about death and people moving out of the area. We can do something about the recruiting process and that it must be JOB ONE. It is everyone's priority. We cannot be recycling the same folks in our club's leadership positions. We need to do a better job of training our members to assume the leadership roles in our club's. How do you train your members? First, start with a new member orientation program that informs the member about Lionism, our history, what we do. Second, encourage members to attend our district conventions to learn about our service projects. And Third, encourage members to continue their training with MD5M leadership training programs. This is not easy, it is called encouragement and identifying your members to help them to assume leadership roles in your club. Bottom line: DESIRE. You must decide if you want new members in your club. You must make the decision to become a recruiter for your club. Is everyone on board with getting new members in your club? Do you have fun service projects? Is your club visible in your community? How do you know? Are your meetings fun? Do all your members know the procedures for joining? Do you have a story of what Lions means to you? Are prospective members welcomed at your meetings? Last but not least, do you have a new member orientation / training program at your club? 2. The following Lions are not eligible to attend: District Governors, Vice District Governors, Past District Governors, International Directors and Past International Directors.
3. The applicant must have never attended a Lions Club International Leadership Institute.
4. The purpose of the Institute is to provide Leadership Development Training to emerging Lion leaders. The goal is to search out at least six emerging leaders in each of the 12 Districts in MD5M. ## Lions of 5M3

Our **Sherburn Lions Club** has just completed LIONS KIDSIGHT (VISION SCREENING) services held in conjunction with the annual pre-school screening held at Sherburn Elementary School this week. Completed over a 3-day period April 6, 7, 8, Martin County West Pre-School children ranging in age from 3 to 5 years old went through the screening events at appointed times throughout the three days to complete general hearing, vision screening, along with additional Individual Developmental Learning Readiness checks.

This year, a total of 57 children were screened for potential vision related concerns. The KIDSIGHT Camera device identified several (8) children for "referrals" to an optometrist or ophthalmologist which may then lead to corrective vision support, depending on further medical diagnosis with a vision professional!

"Thanks" going out to the following LIONS who volunteered their time in supporting the MCW School District's pre-school screening program through Lions KIDSIGHT:

David Traetow, Dennis Larson, Gary Manzey, Rex Wohlhuter, John Tirevold, David Janssen and Dale Harbitz. In addition, Adam Smith, Fairmont Lions Club member, shared Thursday afternoon with us while familiarizing himself with the KIDSIGHT equipment and operations so that he could use this same equipment to assist with the pre-school screening process in Granada on Friday of this week! Great to work with each of you this week in assisting this worthwhile venture for our kids! Our Lions Club tallied up at least 48.5 service hours in making this effort successful; so, THANKS AGAIN!

Due to the COVID19 pandemic, our last recent venture with KIDSIGHT occurred two years ago in 2019; so, we actually missed a year until catching up again this Spring with our current pre-school population. The MCW School District staff, along with many parents have expressed thankful appreciation for the support of the LIONS club in providing this service!

The KIDSIGHT diagnostic camera is truly an amazing piece of technology in identifying potential life-altering vision problems in our young children! Today, I had the opportunity to visit with MCW Interim-Superintendent Chad Brusky relating to the possible future use in screening current MCW students of multiple age groups. In sharing with him the Sherburn Lions Club would be most willing to make that service available at any school or age level, providing the coordination of available KIDSIGHT equipment can be scheduled within the 5M3 calendar for our local use.

As this equipment is free for each Lions Club to use upon availability, there is a printer which travels with several other pieces of camera equipment so that copies of individual screening results may be printed for the parents and school nurse; while the State of Minnesota Health Services requires documentation of the actual screening results from each school.

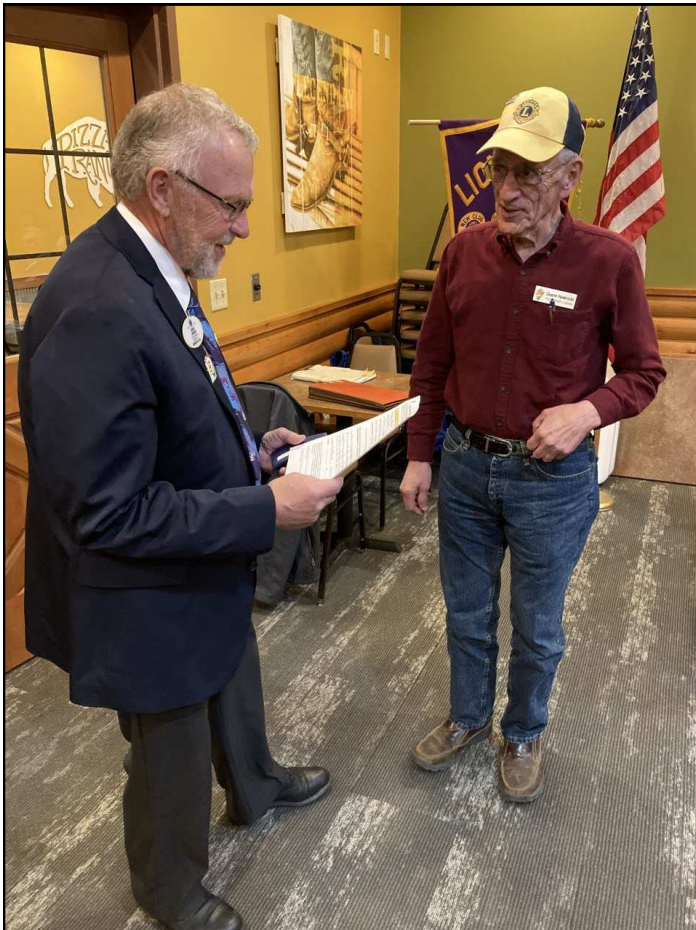

# 2021 Lions Clubs International Convention moving to virtual event

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Here are some important details about the 2021 convention we would like to share with you now:

- Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.
- Registration is now open. The registration fee will be US\$50 until March 31, then US\$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29.
- Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.

## Service Ideas for Lions of 5M

2-7-2021 Updated

Here are projects that Lions can do in the 5 keys areas of service along with a few other ideas:

### Vision –

- **Collect used eyeglasses** – give to your MN Lions Vision Foundation Trustee
- **Do KidSight Screening**
- **Donate large print books** to your local library. Put donation labels (Donated by the \_\_\_\_\_ Lions Club with the month and year) in large-print books that are donated to local libraries. (Check with libraries first to see what books they want to acquire.)
- **Help make tactile baby blankets** for babies who are blind or visually impaired, including those with multiple disabilities or deaf blindness. <https://www.pathstoliteracy.org/blog/tactile-baby-blankets>. Donate locally, if needed, or to Perkins International. <https://www.perkins.org/>
- **Construct a Sorry game** for visually-impaired seniors at a nursing home. <https://www.perkinslearning.org/activity/adapted-sorry-board-game>
- **Adapt Connect Four** to be played by those who are visually-impaired at a nursing home: <https://www.pathstoliteracy.org/strategies/adapting-connect-four-players-visual-impairments>
- **Low vision kits** - Create kits for people who have been recently diagnosed as low vision or who are blind: <https://carroll.org/product/mixed-bump-dots/>

These kits can be given to Lions members to begin with and then to people who are identified in the community.

### Environment-

- **Recycles plastic bags and plastic packaging** – get a free bench for your community. <https://www.trex.com/recycling/recycling-programs/>
- **Donate your newspapers and magazine** to others instead of throwing in the garbage.
- **Make a decorative Winter container garden** or a container garden that feeds the birds. A Lions Club can partner with a local nursery and funds raised will be used to support the Lions' environmental projects.
- **Bird Feeders** - Make a variety of treats that will feed and sustain birds and wildlife throughout the winter including bird feeders using cookie cutters; suet-filled orange halves; popcorn and cranberry garlands, and more. These could be made at a Lions meeting just for the Lions or do a community event so more birds are fed in the community.
- **Collect used blue jeans**, wash them, and then cut out pieces using patterns supplied by Sole Hope. The pieces are assembled into "shoe kits" and then shipped to Sole Hope who then sends them in Uganda. In Uganda, seamstresses and cobblers create shoes that are given to children who suffered from jiggers and were treated for them. Jiggers are tiny parasitic insects that burrow into the feet, lay eggs that multiply greatly in size. They can cause pain, itchiness, swelling, infection, and even death. A pair of jeans - destined for the trash - literally can save a child's life! The Scandia-Marine Lions Club has done this project twice and each time it was very well received. <https://solehope.org/>
- **Collect t-shirts** that people no longer want to wear. Wash them and make them into diapers for newborns. The diapers are used as incentives in third-world countries so mothers get prenatal care and deliver their babies in hospitals or centers offering medical care. - **Collect cans**. Turn these in after ward and use the proceeds to support an environmental project.
- **Collect Can tabs**: Clubs can collect tabs for a charity of choice. Just an easy project without investment. Collect for Shriners or they can also be collected for the Ronald McDonald House.
- **Recycle sneakers** so they can be transformed into Nike Grind material which is used in performance products and sport surfaces. The Reuse-A-Shoe program recycles athletic shoes at the end of their life, giving them a new life through Nike Grind. Bring shoes to the Lions event and they will be brought to the Nike store in Eagan, MN. **Any brand** of athletic sneakers is accepted. However, Nike is unable to recycle sandals, dress shoes, boots, or shoes with metal (like cleats or spikes).
- **Recycle medical equipment** (e.g., crutches, wheelchairs, scooters) to create a "library" of items that can be checked out at no cost and used until no longer needed. When done with the item, it should be returned to the Medical Equipment Library (MEL). Each club or zone could establish a MEL.
- **Sand and varnish "tree cookies"** for use in classrooms throughout Minnesota. Help classroom teachers across Minnesota teach children how trees and other woody plants grow, factors that affect tree growth, and tree identification. Teachers love having sets of cookies like these in their classrooms but don't have time or tools to make them. The DNR needs volunteers to create "tree cookies" -- slices of branches or trunks that show the rings of a tree. 100 cookies supplies three classes of students, so the more that can be made, the better: [http://files.dnr.state.mn.us/education\\_safety/education/plit/activity\\_sheets/treeCookie.pdf](http://files.dnr.state.mn.us/education_safety/education/plit/activity_sheets/treeCookie.pdf)
- **Build bluebird houses** or other types of birdhouses. Install these at a state park at a state park (with permission) or in a city park (again, with permission). The Lions would need to check on these feeders and clean them out unless someone from the state or city would do that.

### Hunger –

- **Food for Seniors** - Shop and deliver food for at-risk seniors.
- **Prepare and/or serve food** at Loaves and Fishes - <https://www.loavesandfishesmn.org/>
- **Pack food** (purchase it as well) to create "Backpack Food packs" for youth in our community in need. Reach out to public, charter, and homeschool co-ops. Provide nutritious food (not typical food shelf macaroni and cheese, ramen noodles, etc. that promote diabetes).
- **Make placemats** for Meals on Wheels – sewn or colored. The colored placemats will be laminated so they can be reused. <https://meals-on-wheels.com/volunteer/families/other-family-volunteer-opportunities/>
- **Collect food for a local food shelf**. Emphasize that people donate:
  - Whole grain products (with at least 16 grams or more of whole grains per serving)
  - Food low in saturated and trans fats
  - Food low in sodium
  - Lean sources of protein (plant and animal sources; canned or dried)
  - Fruits that are minimally processed (canned or dried; whole, cut-up, or pureed)
  - Vegetables that are minimally processed (canned or dried; whole, cut-up, or mashed)
  - Dairy products or milk substitutes that are high in calcium
  - Beverages including 100% fruit or vegetable juice
  - Basic staple foods
  - Staple foods that encourage cooking and baking at home (e.g., broth, flour)

- **Create Blessing Bags**. These bags have a variety of non-perishable food, silverware, disposable plates, and napkins to give to people asking for money at stoplights. They also can be distributed to people who are near homeless shelters. <https://www.thriftynorthwestmn.com/blessing-bag-meals/>
- **Decorate lunch bags** for Meals on Wheel recipients. In addition to receiving the hot portion of the meal in a tray, Meals on Wheels recipients get the cold portion in a lunch bag. Add life to their meals by decorating lunch bags! Simply buy paper lunch bags and use your creativity, crayons, markers, stickers, or any art materials you have on hand.
- **Assemble food kits** with 14-days' worth of food for people who are at high-risk and can't go to grocery stores because of COVID-19. People are identified as recipients by self-identification or through local non-profits (e.g., churches, senior centers). More information is here: <https://extension.umn.edu/news/rural-grocer-networks-feed-those-isolation>. This is the list of suggested items for the kit and a note that explains the contents to the recipient: <https://conservancy.umn.edu/bitstream/handle/11299/212116/14%20Day%20Meal%20Kit%20Guide.pdf?sequence=1&isAllowed=y>
- **Assemble "Dinner's on Us" kits**. <https://b-inspiredmama.com/dinner-random-act-of-kindness/> to be distributed as determined by each Lions Club.
- **Assist any local free meal program** with shut-in deliveries.
- **Help with Meals on Wheels** and deliver meals.
- **Volunteer at a food shelf or pantry** – stock shelves, or help with the whatever is needed at the food shelf

### Diabetes-

- **Collect recipes** – then create a diabetic cookbook
- **Take At-Risk Test** - Have group take Diabetes at Risk Test.
- **Start a walking group** – start with club members and ask community members to join you.
- **Collect non-perishable food** that is healthy for low-income people with diabetes (this also crosses over to be a hunger project): canned spinach, brown rice, whole-grain pasta, quinoa, millet, canned salmon, sardines, albacore (white) tuna in water, herring, no-salt kidney beans, no-salt pinto beans, no-salt black beans, walnuts, pecans, macadamia nuts, almonds, mandarin oranges in water, canned sweet potatoes, extra-virgin olive oil, and chia seeds.
- **Do testing for diabetic retinopathy** (which causes blindness) and test blood glucose or A1C levels. If people test positive for these problems, they will receive a referral to their doctor. The Lions also will mail them a link to get a free kit if they have Type 1 Diabetes: <https://www.jdrf.org/t1d-resources/newly-diagnosed/>. For those with Type 2 Diabetes, the Lions would create their own kit that they can mail based on what's in the JDRF kits.
- **Put donation labels** in books (Donated by the \_\_\_\_\_ Lions Club with the month and year) about Diabetes (Type 1 and Type 2), healthy eating, and exercise/fitness that are donated to a local school and/or public libraries. (Check with libraries first to see what books they want to acquire.)

### Childhood Cancer –

- **Drive patient** along with family members to doctor visits.
- **Shovel snow** for help out family that has child with cancer.
- **Baby-sit** for parents who need to take a child to treatment.
- **Deliver meal** to family that has child suffering from cancer.
- **Donate gas card** to help with cancer patients, especially if they have to travel far for treatment.
- **Support Gilda's Club** - Collect money to support Gilda's Club Twin Cities and the teen program there. Money raised will purchase an item (or more) off of their Amazon.com list: <https://smile.amazon.com/hz/charitylist/1s1KUNIRCD8IJB>. The mission of Gilda's Club Twin Cities (GCTC) is to ensure that all people impacted by cancer are empowered by knowledge, strengthened by action, and sustained by community. They aim to serve everyone impacted by

cancer – those with a cancer diagnosis as well as their friends and family and those living with loss.

- **Set up a pediatric cancer fund** to which families with a child who has cancer can apply to help defray medical costs. Promote it on the club's Facebook page and website as well as through local media.
- **Sponsor C.C. Bears** through Children's Cancer Research Fund in Minneapolis. <https://childrenscancer.org/resources-for-families/c-c-bear/>. Purchase 20 bears at \$25 each so 50 children with pediatric cancer can receive a bear.
- **Create chemo care kits** for children. (Make sure to find a hospital or organization before we make the kits to ask if there are special requirements and/or items that are especially needed.) Here's a link for some ideas: <https://penniesoftime.com/service-project-for-kids-chemo-care-kit-for-kids/>
- **Help serve meals** to patients and families at the U of M Masonic Children's Hospital.
- **Make fleece tied blankets** for children who have cancer, and donate the quilts to Project Linus. (<https://www.projectlinus.org/patterns/>)
- **Make masks** for children with cancer at St. Jude Hospital or any of your local clinics.
- **Make pillowcases** for A Case for Smiles. Finished pillowcases are distributed to 12 children's hospitals throughout the Twin Cities and Duluth <https://caseforsmiles.org/minneapolis/>
- **Knit caps** for children who have cancer. These can be done with knitting needles or round looms. People also can bring knitted caps they made at home to the event.
- **Donate care bags/backpacks** to those in the hospital.
- **Donate cleaning supplies** and make masks for at risk community members and hospitals during the pandemic.

### Other Service Ideas:

- **Send cards to Seniors** – especially those in senior center. Seniors feel very isolated and many are very lonely during this coronavirus pandemic. Great project to do for Valentine's Day!!!!
- **We Care Kits for Seniors** living in senior centers. Include small gifts, Hallmark cards so they can mail to friends, stationary, envelopes, stamps, pens, puzzles, poems
- **Donate cleaning supplies** for schools.
- **Support local police & fire department** - make snack boxes and deliver to them.
- **Vaccination Help** - Now that state is issuing vaccines, Lions can help with registration and general greeting and checking in people at vaccine sites. Contact County Public Health for info on distribution sites and dates.

### Fundraising Ideas:

- **Have an On-Line Garage Sale** – have Lions and community members donate items.
- **Hold an On-Line Raffle** – raffle off item needed in your community
- **Drive-Thru soup or cookie fundraiser** - Have local restaurant make the soup or cookies and then drive by to pick them up
