



"No way!" he gasped, while obviously becoming even more anxious and excited! To which she replied......



How to get your article, picture, or Club event into THE LION Magazine



THE LION Magazine is dedicated to promoting the "We Serve" philosophy that Lions around the world demonstrate every day. They want you to send in your Club's events, humanitarian deeds, fundraisers, and service information to them for consideration of inclusion in the magazine. So to help you get your submission published, they have come up with some helpful guidelines to get your contribution to their pages.

And as a point of information they want you to understand that it is impossible for them to publish everything that is sent to them so please don't be offended if you don't see your submission, it might have been put aside for reason of space. However they do want you to know that the more thoroughly it is prepared and thoughtfully illustrated your article is the higher the chance of getting it selected for publication.

Here is what they want.

They are looking for your well-written articles accompanied by photos, which explain in detail the successful completion of a service project, or fund raising activity. Because an article must have mass appeal to the readers of THE LION they don't usually publish accounts of a Clubs social calendar such as anniversaries.

Here are some helpful hints

The length of a story is not as important as

WHAT the project was about

WHO was involved and who benefited.

WHEN did it take place?

WHERE was the venue or the location it took place in?

HOW it happened.

By detailing how your club helped other people you will help THE LION fulfill it's goal and that is to stimulate other clubs in our district to perform humanitarian services.

THE LION will be happy to include your local newspapers article or picture on the

clubs activities if it is accompanied by the papers standard release for republishing in THE LION.

What makes a good photograph?

A picture is worth a 1000 words. Generally candid action pictures, meaning that they are random not posed, make for more interesting story telling.

Assign a club photographer to take pictures of the club in action to accompany your articles. It is better to have a few people in the photo than to have it too busy. And the only 'cheque presentation picture they will publish is the one that is of your club giving a million dollars to THE LION! So really don't send that style of picture in.

How do they want it?

They want a well-written, proof read, fact correct, typed article.

It can be in point form a news release or an article.

Include your mailing address, daytime phone number, and e-mail address if you have one. Please don't send in multiple articles assign one person to send the articles in for publication. THE LION needs a contact person if a follow up is needed.

Make sure all photos that are submitted are sharp and clear on glossy paper. They cannot use pictures in a PDF file nor can they use photos embedded in a word document. If mailing photos do not stable or write on the photo.

They also can accept digital photos sent via e-mail. The quality must be at least 300 dpi and be saved as either a .jpeg

Joint Photographic Experts Group

It is pronounced, "jay-peg". JPEG is a colour image compression technique. It can reduce files to about 5% of their original file size. However, the more you compress a jpeg the more detail is lost. Or a. tiff file Tagged Image File Format Both are good to send quality photos for publication.
