During 2013-2014, Lions are challenged to follow their dream to reach new heights. Our overall dream as an organization is to serve those in need in every community in the world. To achieve this dream, we must expand our **reach by** strengthening existing clubs, adding new clubs, and recruiting new members.

Service. It's More Than a Dream, It's Our Identity

As Lions, we are a global network dedicated to service and we share the dream of a world without suffering. Last year we provided over 500 million hours of service with a direct impact on over 200 million people. We will continue to strive toward our dream by supporting the following service strategies:



- Participate in the Global Service Action Campaigns of engaging youth (August), working with
 the blind and visually impaired (October), feeding the hungry (December and January), and protecting our environment (April)
- Support the initiative to reduce global poverty
- Continue involvement in tree planting and the Reading Action Program
- Sponsor a Friends & Family activity or service project in April to introduce your family, friends and neighbors to your Lions club

Responsibility, Recognition and Reach

As Lions we have a strong sense of awareness of the needs of others and a sense of responsibility to make our communities better. We know that responsibility means taking care of others, being accountable and being trustworthy. Responsibility also means ownership: owning what needs to be done, then finding a way to get it done. It involves taking risks and working hard. We must also let other Lions be responsible for their own challenges and their own dreams. To encourage them to achieve their dreams, we should provide recognition of their achievements. Organize new clubs, striving for at least 25 charter members to improve club viability and vitality.

Sharing the Dream of Service

Lions share the dream of service; they want to serve and make a difference. Lions are making a significant service contribution while adding enthusiasm, ingenuity and innovation. Lions can serve as mentors to provide guidance, encouragement and recognition.

Another way to increase our capacity for service is through effective public relations, sharing stories of Lions projects with the public and potential new members. Public relations is no longer left to the professional. Today each member can share the Lions story with passion, conviction and photos via web sites and social media. To share our dream of service we will:

- Establish an e-clubhouse website for each new club
- Share district and club service project stories and photos via MyLCI service activity reports, club websites and social media
- Some of our most impressive Lions success stories result from service supported by the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). Since its establishment in 1968 LCIF has awarded over 11,000 grants totaling more than US\$811 million in the areas of sight, youth, disaster relief and other humanitarian efforts. LCIF keeps dreams alive for millions around the world. To support LCIF we will:
 - Increase the understanding of LCIF's programs and their impact
 - Support special campaigns of LCIF and our partner organizations
 - Promote donations to LCIF from clubs and individuals

Now more than ever there are people in need, and those people need Lions. There is no time like the present to set your sights on a dream and inspire others to achieve a new high standard.

USA/Canada Leadership Forum — Sept 19-22 in Overland Park, Kansas

Q: I'm just a plain ordinary Lion and not a leader, why should I attend the Lions Leadership Forum?

A: At the forum, you will have the opportunity to meet other "just plain lions," share ideas and learn from all the seminars. You can always learn new ideas from other lions, and they will want to learn from hearing about your club and your service projects as well.

Q: How many seminars can I attend?

A: Each Lion will be able to attend 4 seminars (2 in the morning and 2 in the afternoon) from an offering of more than 30 on Friday. On Saturday there will be 3 seminar sessions (8:00 am, 10:00 am and 2:30 pm) as well as the featured lunch presentation by our International President. If you are a first-timer at the Lions Leadership Forum, be sure to arrive early on Thursday to take in a special orientation that is geared towards you!

Q: Will I have a chance to ask questions during the seminars? I have a few topics I would like to learn more about.

A: All of our seminar presenters allow for time for questions at the conclusion of each session. Most seminars are interactive which will allow you ro discuss your questions or concerns with other Lions in a round-table format. You will find that the learning and sharing continues over the lunches and coffee breaks as well.

Q: Does my registration include meals?

A: Your registration includes 4 meals, 3 of those include presentations by professional speakers. Thursday Evening Dinner, Friday Luncheon, and the Saturday Banquet all include presentations by outstanding world-class presenters (check out the speakers page for more on this). Remember, the Saturday Luncheon includes a presentation by our International President.

Q: My spouse is not a Lion, can they attend the seminars and hear the speakers too?

A: Yes! Non-Lions are encouraged to attend and may want to take in the seminar on family membership.

An Annual Art Contest for Kids

Each year, Lions clubs around the world proudly sponsor the Lions International **Peace Poster Contest** in local schools and youth groups. This art contest for kids encourages young people worldwide to express their visions of peace. For 25 years, more than four million children from nearly 100 countries have participated in the contest.

The theme of the 2013-14 Peace Poster Contest is "Our World, Our Future." Students, ages 11, 12 or 13 by November 15, are eligible to participate. The students could be scouting groups, church groups, and schools in your area.
