The Latest Screening Results

Since July 1, 2012 we have screened more than 32,853 children statewide and referred 4,017. The rate of referral is 12.2 percent. In 6C 19,560 children were screened and 2,510 referred. The rate of referral for the district is 12.8 %. I will report final numbers and financial information in the annual report which will be sent to all clubs later in July.

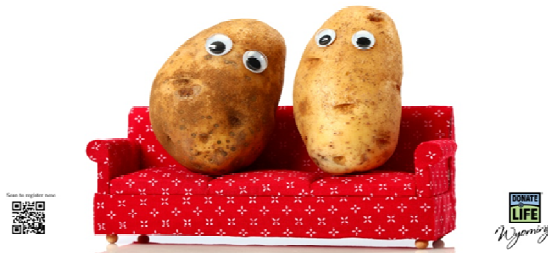

RMLEB Develops New Marketing Campaign for Driver's License

Previous research shows that one of the top reasons people say no to becoming an eye, organ and tissue donor is that they rule themselves out. They may think they are too poor of health or too old to help someone through donation. What they don't know is that this perception is wrong.

The eye bank's public and professional relations department hopes to help this group of potential donors overcome this objection through a new ad campaign that was placed in Wyoming Driver's License Offices beginning in May. The ad campaign includes direct messages and eye-catching photos informing readers that

To ensure the messages are well received by the target audience, all ads were

tested in focus groups. Robert Austin, PR department manager said, "we have taken what we learned from the focus groups to refine our messages. The final ads came from research, not a hunch."

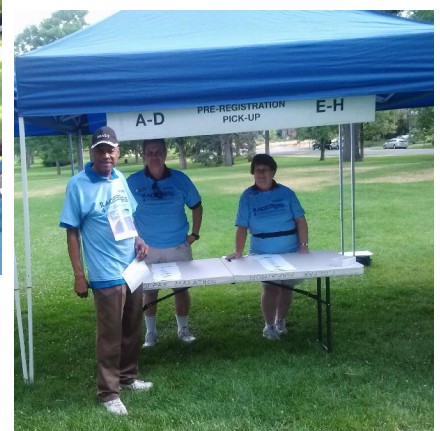
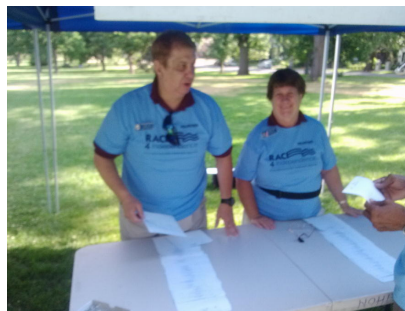
Colorado and Wyoming, the two states within our recovery area, generally rank near the top when it comes to donor designation rates. This means that a high percentage of people that obtain a driver's license also sign up to becoming an eye, organ and tissue donor.

While it may not be possible to increase this number by a large margin, no change can be expected without research-driven objectives.

Not only do we have the fun and honor of working with our community, but since half the funds raised go to the Lions Club it enables us to help ever more people in need while having a great time at the Park!

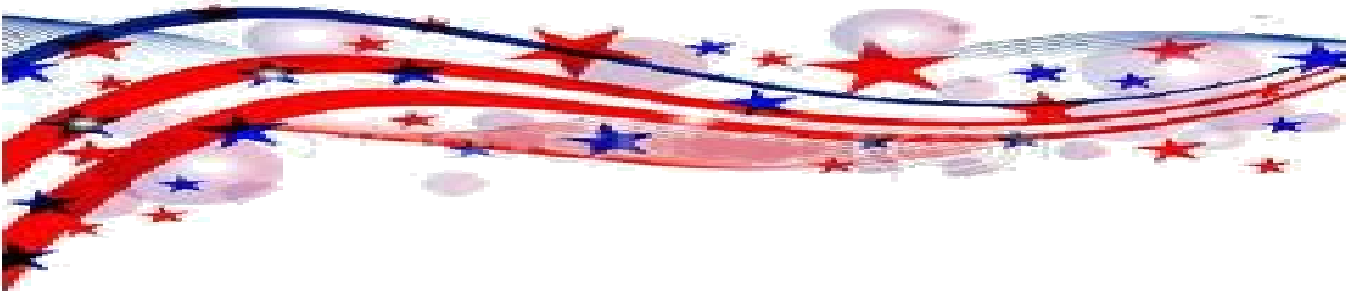


Ms Colorado Lion Gail Hamilton
