The work on helping those affected by the flood waters continues. We now have \$10,000 in hand and the work begins to spend for those in need. A lot of ground work was done before the monies arrived. However, there was not a lot of response. After a meeting this last Saturday, Lions Jack Russalesi, Andy Smith, Carl Gentzel, Barbara Walmsley and myself have each been given a spe-



cific assignment to make contacts with churches, Emergency and Family Assistance Administration in Boulder (EFAA) and homeless shelters. While no areas in our district will go without needed assistance, right now Boulder seems to be the hardest hit. PDG Vern Crowe has been with the Boulder County Sheriff's Office for a number of years and he will be called upon for critical information.

While I personally feel, as I am sure others do, we have missed the first round of needed assistance, but the second round is equally important. Some are still in need of help with food, supplies and prescriptions. Some have not been reached at all and as some agencies pull out our work starts. There will be a call to Lions of 6C to help with distribution of these supplies within the next week or so. I am sure we can still be helpful in cleaning up homes or shelters. The money that was received from LCIF has very strict criteria on how the money can be spent. It cannot be used to rebuild.

6C received a check from the Story, Wyoming Lions Club for \$500. I talked with DG Ronnie Martin from Texas while I was at the Forum and his district is eager to provide a monetary donation. Thank you to the clubs that responded to my e-mail asking what they had done to be of help to those in their communities. Thornton, Five Points, Louis-ville, Lafayette, Littleton and Bennett-Watkins have provided personal and club donations. THANK YOU!

I returned safely from the "Land of Oz". This was my first Forum and what a great experience. Again, I was able to meet other Lions from around the US much like the International, but on a smaller scale. I believe there is something to be said for the Lions of Colorado when all DGs, 1st VDGs, and 2nd VDGs were in attendance. I believe we are in good hands. All of our DGs received the first level of ID Palmer's Dream Achiever award.



As I visit clubs around the district, one in particular sticks in my mind. I visited Bennett-Watkins last week. As I drove, I felt as though I was returning to the "Land of Oz". But, I digress. I talked with the club about "Follow Your Dream" and asked about having a dream and seeing it to fruition. I received an e-mail from President Jo saying that when she became President it was her dream to have KidSight location in all corridor towns. In 6C, 1122 children have been screened with 215 referred (19% referral rate).
