

Thoughts for December

This time of year as we gather with family and friends we are all grateful for all of our blessings. I am grateful to have the wonderful support and friendship of the Lions of District 6C and of course the Lions throughout Colorado as well as the support for our KidSight Colorado Program from all of you.

I am also grateful for a few other things. I am grateful for my family of course. I know some of you may disagree with me but I am also grateful for technology! The internet, email, Facebook and our website makes it easy for me to reach out to you and also for you to contact me. I am especially grateful for the new vision screener technology that is allowing us to screen more children more quickly and find vision problems that we could not detect in the past. In the past week I have detected strabismus in two children. Strabismus occurs when there is a deviation from the normal orientation of one or both eyes so that both cannot be directed at the same object at the same time and is caused by a muscle imbalance in the eye. This vision problem cannot be detected unless you screen both eyes at the same time like we can with our new Plusoptix vision screener. I am working on ways to obtain more of these machines for use by our KidSight screeners.

I want to wish you the happiest of holidays and joy in the NewYear. Thank you for all you do for the Colorado Lions Kid-Sight Program.

The Latest Screening Results

13,856 screenings have been processed since July 1 with 1,868 children referred. The rate of referral is 13.5%. Michele has many more sessions to enter.

District 6C, 7,050 children screened 935 referred 13.3%

It is amazing what a half-blind, illiterate, and angry child growing up in a Massachusetts poorhouse accomplished in her lifetime. But without Anne Sullivan, it would have not been possible! The second article was about a man, Don Colcord, in a tiny Colorado town called Nucla. The population is 650 and he was the town's pharmacist, handyman and he ran the local Health Fair for 27 years. He was also a long time Lions member before the Club was closed over 10 years ago.

A few other items to note. I have my DG Pin and it is the coolest for sure. It has Lion riding a bicycle in the mountains and my theme is: Riding High with the Lions. Being a geek, I read the Popular Science magazine. In the December edition they featured the 100 Best Innovations of the Year. The first innovation was The Bionic Eye, called Argus II. This device enables the blind to see.

I am a volunteer reader for the Audio Information Network of Colorado. This nonprofit organization provides news, publications, current events, and job openings for people who are blind or who have impaired vision. I read a 25 minute segment of the City of Craig Daily Press.

Let's get out there and TALK to our neighbors, friends, teachers, barbers, bakers, accountants. Let them know what the volunteers in Lions Clubs do and ASK them about what improvements they would like to see in their communities. A great way to add service projects. They know you care about the world that they live in and this would be a good idea for a new member, someone that we know.


