
Each of our districts has received grants and in many cases more than their contributions and it is important that we convey this message to our clubs. We want to increase the awareness of the benefits received from giving to LCIF and the many miracles we help make happen by our generosity. Your support and cooperation this year working in partnership will continue to make LCIF the #1 Non-Governmental Organization (NCO) in the world and with greater awareness in out districts of the many miracles preformed through LCIF. Club participation will increase resulting in more people receiving services through these endeavors.

To update you of our successes District 1-A is ranked 339th world wide, with your support and help we can better this number. Contributions from 1968 to June 8, 2010 \$1,111,683.83 and rank #2 in MD-1. State wide we have raised \$6,472,075.00. These include both Campaign Sight First and Campaign Sight First 2. District 1-A has received \$375,940.00 in grants & I believe there will be another grant application this year. State wide programs have received over \$1,400,000.00. Many of these are matching grants. I am proud that our district has never had a year with out participation. We currently have 756 MJF Fellows and 71 Progressive MJF's.
