Dianne accepted a position as the Executive Director of Middle Tennessee Lions Sight Service in August 2021. Middle Tennessee Lions Sight Service provides assistance to those in need who have vision problems. Presently MTLSS has a Low Vision program and helps to provide cataract surgeries.

She often serves as a speaker, nationally and internationally, and has been a presenter at a number of Lions Clubs District and Multiple Conventions, Women Symposiums, and Leadership Seminars. She has served as Peace Poster Chair and Convention Chair for her district. Dianne served as a speaker in various areas before Lions: church groups of all ages, newborn classes, parenting classes, and spoke on various medical topics.

Dianne has been given a Presidential Certification of Appreciation. She has received a Tennessee Ambassador of Goodwill and a United States President's Voluntary Award. She was presented an Edwin Dalstrom Distinguished Service Award (given by Mid-South Lions Sight and Hearing Service). She is a Progressive Melvin Jones, a Lindsey Jennings Fellow, a Betty Coffey Fellow, and a WP Woods Fellow. She has also been presented the Lions Clubs International Ambassador of Goodwill, the highest honor the Lions Clubs International bestows.

Dianne and Bob have five children, three daughters and two sons. They have nine grandchildren, four grandsons and five granddaughters. Dianne is never happier than when she is surrounded by her children and grandchildren.
