As of January 26, 2021, Our District Virtual Hunger Campaign has achieved 89% of our overall goal. District 1A's goal in partnering with the Greater Chicago Food Depository (GCFD) is to alleviate hunger in the Chicagoland area and surrounding suburbs. The impact of the two Blast Chiller will



help support 149,760 meals chilled per year. One Blast Chiller unit will impact 864 people each year when broken down means 2 meals/day, 5 days/week, 52 weeks. My fellow Lions we still need your help and support.

OFFICIAL CALL TO CONVENTION

January 19, 2021

All Lions are hereby officially notified that the 53rd Annual Convention for District 1-A, Lions Clubs International will be held March 20-21, 2021 to conduct the Business of the District.

The purpose of the Business of the District is to elect District Officers for the year 2021-2022; and to consider resolutions presented in proper form and order.

In accordance with Article VI, Section 5 of the District 1-A Constitution and By-Laws all Lions Clubs in good standing with District 1-A and Lions Clubs International are entitled to One (1) Delegate and One (1) Alternate for each Ten (10) members or major fraction thereof who have been enrolled for at least one year and one day, based upon membership records as of February 1, 2021, as certified by Lions Clubs International. A newly chartered club that is less than one year and one day is allowed One (1) Delegate and One (1) Alternate.

A Lions Club, to be considered in good standing must have all of its District and State per capita bills paid, and owing Lions Clubs International no more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00), which shall be certified by Lions Clubs International. Outstanding bills must be paid 15 days in advance to Lions Club International and District 1-A to be eligible to vote. Any monies paid after the 15 days will bring your clubs bills current but will not entitle you to vote.

Last day for LCI and CT Andy Liamaga to receive dues is March 6, 2021.

Subject to the provisions of the International Constitution and By-Laws, any active member in good standing of a chartered Lions Club in good standing in District 1-A endorsement seeking candidate for the office of District Governor, First Vice District Governor, Second Vice District Governor, District 1-A Lions of Illinois Foundation Trustee 2021/2023 or V.O.I.C.E.S Lions 1A **Directors shall:**

(a) Deliver such endorsement by mail with dated postmark from a chartered Lions Club in good standing in District 1-A a resolution endorsing such candidate to the District 1-A Cabinet Secretary indicating his/her intention to run for office to;

- (b) Any resolution endorsing a candidate for the District 1-A offices mentions above will be read at the, February 6, 2021 District 1-A Cabinet meeting, if received on or before, January 31, 2021.
- (c) Each notice so delivered shall be presented by the Nominating and Resolutions Committee to the District 1-A cabinet, February 6, 2021 for

review of qualifications. After presentations to the District 1-A cabinet, if there are no objections, the Nominating Committee shall place in nomination at the March 2021 District 1-A Convention the names of all candidates so qualified.

- (d) Any chartered Lions Club in good standing in District 1-A may submit a resolution nominating a qualified active member of said club for the office of District Governor, First Vice District Governor, Second Vice District Governor, District 1-A Lions of Illinois Foundation 2021/2023 Trustee V.O.I.C.E.S Lions 1A Directors. Each club shall furnish with the said notice of the nominee's intention to run for office evidence of his/her compliance with the qualifications for said office set the International out in Constitution and By-Laws.
- (e) Candidates seeking endorsement for the office of

District Governor must currently be serving as First Vice District Governor.

- (f) Candidates seeking endorsement for the office of First Vice District Governor must currently be serving as Second Vice District Governor.
- (g) Candidates seeking endorsement for the office of Second Vice District Governor must submit sufficient evidence that he/she has meet the following qualifications:
 - 1) Candidate is an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions Club in District 1-A.
 - 2) Candidate is endorsed by his/her Lions Club.
 - 3) Candidate has served as Club President and Club Board of Directors.
- 5) Candidate has served as Region or Zone Chairperson or Cabinet Secretary and/or Treasurer.None of the above being accomplished concurrently.

Hello to the Lions of MD-1 and beyond from ID Bob & Brenda

Brenda and I hope that everyone is doing well. It is unfortunate that we are still facing the reality of not being able to meet in person for our Club and/or District meetings and fund raising activities. But as Lions we have accepted this challenge and we are becoming good at seeing how to face this ongoing situation.

Congratulations to MD1 for the strong start that we have with the chartering of new clubs within our Multiple. The six new clubs represents your commitment in bringing MD1 back to the leadership role that we once had. The chartering of these new clubs has shown that things can be done during this pandemic.

Your Executive Officers and Board of Directors have been busy, virtually working on some of the concerns that are facing the Association in these times. There was an overall drop in the association membership during the earlier part of this year, but that has been turned around to bring us back over the 1.4M members that we had a year ago.

From the executive Board Meeting a number of resolutions have been presented to the Board of Directors for their approval and all have passed unanimously. They are:

- Charter and entrance fees are waived from January 1- June 30, 2021
- No clubs in good standing on December 31, 2020 will be suspended or canceled through June 30, 2021 for late payment of dues. Full payment is required to be received before June 30, 2021 to avoid suspension or cancellation.

Note that clubs that are placed on financial suspension on December 31, 2020 will remain on suspension until full balance is paid. Those clubs will still need to address their outstanding dues or make arrangements for repayment with the Accounts Receivable Department at LCI to avoid cancellation scheduled for March 31, 2021.

The next resolutions were the hardest decision to make, but necessary to do. Just like other Districts and Multiple Districts, we had to be sensitive to our memberships health and situations regarding worldwide travel restrictions. Yes, the format of the International Convention will be virtual instead of in person as planned. The virtual convention will take place over the same dates - June 25-29, 2021.

There will be a registration fee of \$50.00 till March 31, 2021 and after that it is \$75.00. Registration for Leos is \$30.00. You are able to go to the website to register. If you are already registered for Montreal, you will be contacted directly by LCI to explain the registration options that are available.

The elections of the Executive Officers, International Directors and the voting on proposed resolutions will be conducted electronically. More information will be coming on that soon.

As you can see, the month of January has been busy with the changes that have been made for our association and its future. Please stay in touch with your fellow members, to see that they are doing okay and to see if they are in need of anything. We talk about the service to others, but now we need to take care of our own Lions as well.
