Letter From Executive Director Lions of Illinois Foundation

Memo: Mobile Screening Unit Program To: Our Lions Clubs throughout Illinois



Greetings from your Lions of Illinois Foundation Office. It is important to note that even though our mobile units have been off the road, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, your Programs Committee, Long Range Planning Committee (LRP) and the newly formed Mobile Unit Ad-Hoc Committee have been working diligently throughout to insure that our Mobile Screening Unit Program remains viable and sustainable for years to come.

First, Our Mobile Screening Unit Program is one of our core programs and will be back on the road as soon as the current pandemic conditions/CDC guidelines permit. Hosting forms and current information concerning the mobile unit will be mailed to your club secretaries in January of 2022. We will begin receiving on-line registration January 10th.

Second, The LIF Board of Trustees voted to retire the two older 37' Hearing Units and currently have them for sale. Both Units were at the point where the repairs needed, age of the units, miles and safety concerns warranted the decision to remove them from service.

The goal of the LRP and Programs Committees has always been to create a "Combo or Multiuse Unit" where both vision and hearing screenings can occur out of the same unit. With the remaining unit, the programs committee and unit techs have been testing several scenarios to accomplish this goal. The remaining 27' mobile unit will be on the road in 2022, pandemic/CDC guidelines permitting, as a "Multiuse Unit".

Third, at the November 6th board meeting the Programs and LRP Committees brought forth three action items which were unanimously approved by the board of trustees: **To purchase a multiuse mobile unit for vision and hearing mobile screenings. To maintain two multiuse units on the road from March through October and to replace a multiuse unit every 4-6 years as wear and mileage dictates.** LIF understands the need to have a Mobile Multiuse Vision and Hearing Screening Program, with the future goal of having two units on the road; focusing on joining existing Annual Health Fairs and creating new Annual Health Fairs, to provide a yearly destination that our current public can attend to receive vision and hearing screenings.

Macular Degeneration has increased 50% twice, over 20 years, Diabetic Retinopathy has increased over 50% in the past 20 years and glaucoma 20% over 20 years and by year 2050 it is projected that 2.5 billion people will have some degree of hearing loss.

This is why it is important to be able to maintain these units and keep them road worthy and up to date. There have been several clubs who have already voiced interest in assisting with the purchase of the new unit and LIF will be looking into grant opportunities as well.

Lastly, there will also be an opportunity for clubs to assist with the ongoing costs of operating the Mobile Screening Unit Program. Some simple ways to assist would be to add a line item for "Mobile Screening Unit Program" to your annual budget, pick-up the costs for meals and/or lodging for the mobile unit tech when they are in your district or to simply purchase gas cards from our LIF Gift Card Program to fill a tank, are all ways your club can assist.

We will be sending additional information out to your club secretaries.

Review of Information:

- At this time LIF has one multiuse unit that, as the pandemic/CDC guidelines permit, will be out on the road in 2022, with the focus being on Health Fairs.
- The LIF Mobile Unit Ad-Hoc Committee is currently collecting information and pricing for the purchase of a new multiuse unit.
- The Board of Trustees approved the motion to maintain two multiuse units on the road from March through October and to replace a multiuse unit every 4-6 years as wear and mileage dictates.
- Ways your club can assist with the ongoing operating costs of the program.

The Lions of Illinois Foundation partners with Spectrios Institute for Low Vision, the Illinois College of Optometry, and the Chicago Lighthouse for the Blind to provide a FREE comprehensive visual

evaluation to Illinois students in grades K-12.

Students are referred by special education staff employed by the Illinois Board of Education. The exams are performed by licensed optometrists that travel to the different screening locations throughout the state.

Other components of the program include:

Referring parents to vocational counseling Braille reading instruction Orientation and mobility training for child Adaptive technology training



The LIF "Seeing is Believing" Low Vision Program for Students provides a visually impaired child with the optical tools and training necessary to help prevent further vision loss or even blindness.
