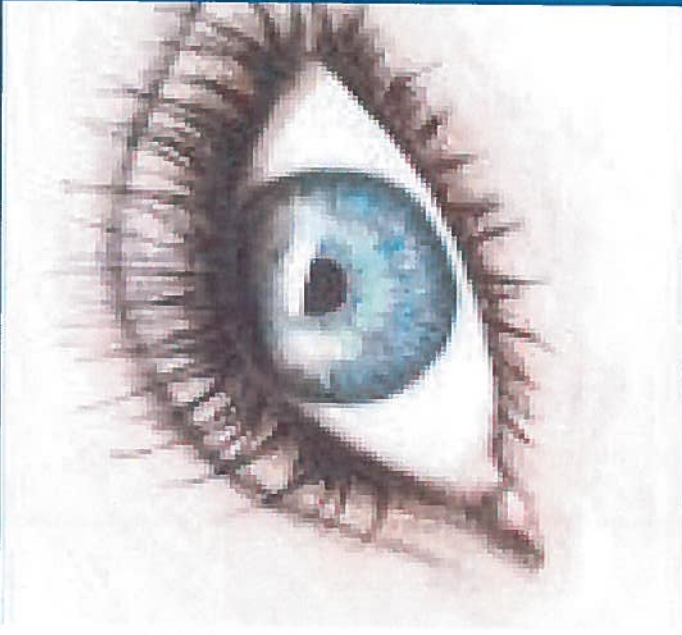
SERVICE LIONS1A) has become a reality.
