

Diabetes: Chair Laura Bader presented a new direction for the committee, suggesting that there might be a more effective way to help folks in need. She requested feedback from the cabinet and received a positive response on her suggestions. The suggestions Laura presented are in the written report she submitted. It is attached. Laura presented a bill for \$167, submitted by the Mayville club, asking approval for payment of a diabetic eye exam.

A motion to pay the bill from the diabetes fund was made/supported. There was discussion about the proper fund to use (Diabetes or Vision Services). The motion passed.

A motion to accept and use the application Laura presented was made/supported. After discussion a motion to amend the original motions was made to require applications be submitted thru Lions clubs. The motion to amend was supported. The motion to amend passed. The original motion passed as amended.

A motion was made/supported to approve up to \$1000 for the diabetes committee's use in the new program. The motion passed.

District Convention: PDG Alice Zajac reported the 2012 convention will be held in Traverse City at the Park Hotel April 14 - 16. They have lots of stuff in the works and PDG Alice guarantees lots of fun. A projected convention budget was presented, copy attached. PDG Ron Johnson stated they would have the 2013 location determined by the Fall Conference.

District Editor: PDG Ron Johnson asked everyone to email information to either Ron or Shari Johnson so they could get it in the newsletter.

District 11 Multiple Convention: PDG Sturgis said the last convention in Auburn Hills was a great success and the 2012 convention is scheduled May 18 & 19. It will be at the Crowne Plaza hotel in Grand Rapids. He asked that we try to talk it up and expect good things. PDG Bob said one of the highlights would be a tour of the facility that prepares the eyeglasses we collect for shipment overseas.

District GLT: 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG Jake Dasho reported that Chair Bart Blegen would be attending training shortly.

District GMT: PDG Alice Zajac said they will be training Zone Chairmen and facilitators at Fritz's restaurant on Sep 14<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm.

District Newsletter: Gov. Hartwick presented Chair Phyllis Pross with a certificate of appreciation, signed by IPDG "Doc" McCray. There was thunderous applause from the appreciative audience.

District Photographer: Chair Jeff Hunt had no photos to report.

District Resolutions: Chair PDG Bill Erickson stated they would have some.

District Officers Training: Chair PDG Bill Erickson stated they had some.

Elections: Chair PDG Bill Erickson stated they will have some.

George E. Daly Award: Chair Frank Rivette said they will have one.

Hearing/Speech/Deaf: Chair Gerald Kamrath announce that they are effectively recycling used hearing aids. Jerry requested \$1000 for future committee use. A motion to approve was made/supported. Discussion included a request that future reports let us know how many folks were helped. Motion passed.

Honorary: Chair IPDG "Doc" stated that a problem solving forum will help.

Information Technology: Chair PDG Larry Porn stated he had a computer set up for any interested parties to view after the meeting. He reported that Phyllis Pross would add a line to the newsletter with the link to access the district site.

International Convention: Chair PDG Frank Rivette thanked those that had attended his brother Frenchy's wake/service. It was very much appreciated by the family. He reported that the 95<sup>th</sup> Lions Clubs International Convention would be in Busan, Korea June 22-26, 2012.

L.C.I.F.: Chair PDG Sturgis reported that there had been 59 contributing lions for a total of \$1895.

Leader Dog: Chair IPDG "Doc" said "Big "D" night is Oct 18th, come see the changes. It's D1 against D2 competition." 1st VDG Karen Ates added that our district was the #3 contributor even though we didn't have 100% of our clubs contributing.

Leader Dog Puppies: Chair JoAnne McDonald introduced their new puppy "Logan", named for the restaurant they often frequent. She also stated she had free tickets to the Renaissance festival.

Leadership Development: Gov. Hartwick stated it had been included in the GLT/GMT reports.

Leo Clubs: No representative present.

Liaison: Chair PDG Thompson had no report.

Lions of Michigan Foundation: Chair PDG Erickson said the raffle tickets would be mailed out in October. He reported that last year the raffle raised \$90,000 and they had just spent \$7600 on surgery for a district resident that had a detached retina. PDG Bill encouraged clubs to consider the ticket sales as their club fundraiser also, using the Auburn – Williams club results as an example.

Michigan Eye Bank: Chair PDG Sturgis reported they had a celebration at the Dow Diamond in Midland last night. All club presidents had been invited and while PDG Bob was disappointed that only 10 club presidents showed he was pleased to state that total attendance was 180, many of whom were PDGs. PDG Bob reminded us that they Eye Bank became a state project in 1971 and he encouraged us to get the word out as they need our continued support.

Nominating: Chair Dale McDonald had no report.

Paws with a Cause: No representative present.

Peace Poster Contest: Region Chair Jim Ates stated they want 40 – 50 entries from our district. He requested \$25 from the budget to purchase 2 kits @ \$12.50. Motion made/supported to provide the money. Cabinet Treasurer Wile\_E noted that it would almost drain their account. A collection was quickly made, raising over \$100 to cover the cost. Motion passed.

Public Relations: Chair PDG Frank Rivette stated "No report."

Quest: Chair PRC Leo Dolehanty stated they had a request from Bay City asking for help getting the program up and running again.

Radio Reading Services: Chair PLDP Laura Brugger had no report.

Rules: Chair Region Chair Dennis Poirier had no report.

Sergeant at Arms: Chair Joe Gwizdala III had no report.

Sickle Cell Anemia: Cahir Tyrone Frazier had no report.

Special Needs: Chair PDG Richard Brugger stated "They are all our kids. Don't forget them at the Parade of Checks."

PDG Barnum reported that the proposed Special Needs mint sale at the Frankenmuth car show had been canceled for lack of enough volunteers.

Strategic Planning: PDG R.G. Barnum reported that 5 districts were in trouble as they were below International required membership/clubs. One proposal was to combine the 5 districts into 3 districts. A second proposal was to redistrict all 10 districts into 6 districts. He stated a committee was working on it and a report will be made after a committee meeting in October.

USA/Canada Forum Coordinator: Chair PDG Barnum reported the forum is next month in Anchorage, AK.

Vision Services: Chair Stu Menzies reported receipt of our Pedia-Vision camera grant request by LCIF. He stated we had almost \$6000 set aside for our \$5000 portion and were on our way towards funding a second camera.

Stu told us that District A-2 purchased 4 cameras but had decided not to be a conforming district and were going to go it alone. He then requested a motion to approve the conforming district agreement distributed at the last cabinet meeting and in the last district newsletter. A motion was made/supported authorizing the Governor and the Cabinet Secretary to sign the agreement. Discussion included questions about paid staff and district monetary obligations. Comments were that

paid staff would be a director with a salary in the \$20,000 – 30,000 range and that there was no monetary obligation on any district signing the agreement. DG Hartwick suggested that we should wait until after the next Council of Governors meeting to make a decision as the proposed director, Linda Boseman, would be making a presentation at that meeting. A motion was made to amend the original motion and table until the next cabinet meeting. The motion to amend died for lack of a second. The vote was called and the original motion was defeated. It was noted that the issue could be raised again at the next cabinet meeting. PRC Dolehanty noted that the vote was a reflection of the upcoming information expected, not the presentation by Chair Menzies.

Bay City Lions President Joe Gwizdala presented a \$100 check from the Monitor Twp. Firefighters, donated to the Pedia-Vision camera fund (Kid's Sight).

Welcome Homes: Region 1 representative Janet Grieves reported they had a new address and phone number and that they had a state meeting next weekend. She noted that the number of folks being helped is on the increase. They are assisting folks at home as well as in the group homes.

White Cane: No representative.

Youth Exchange: Chair RC Jim Ates reported that had one student coming in and there will be more information to come.

Old business: Saginaw Spirit fundraiser Chair Joe Gwizdala III reported the game has been scheduled for Feb 24th 2012. The game starts at 7:11 pm and the tickets will be available for sale on Sep. 1st 2011. The sale price of the tickets is \$13.50 which gives us a \$4/ticket profit. If 500 or more tickets are sold we will also be able to participate in a 50/50 drawing held by the Spirit Organization. They are asking for 6 volunteers to sell 50/50 tickets. The winner will get ½ the money and if we qualify, by selling 500 tickets, we get to split the remainder of the money with the Spirit Charities. Selling 500 or more tickets also qualifies us to pick someone to drop the puck on center ice. Chair Gwizdala thinks we can use that opportunity to raffle off the chance for the puck drop and raise some additional money. He is asking each club to sell a minimum of 15 tickets. There is no maximum and the Spirit does not require us to pay up front, so there will be plenty of tickets available for sale. Joe also noted that ticket sales could occur on line. We would get credit if the purchaser used the ID "lionsd1" and the password "sightfirst". Please use all lower case letters and note that the quotation marks are not part of either the ID or the password.

New business: PDG RG Barnum announced that Esther Lamott would be running again for the position of International Director.

Region Chair Jim Ates questioned procedure for out of district folks, working in district, who needed help with sight. The

problem is some areas do not have a local club to assist. A suggestion was made to contact the closest club and if there was an unmet need to request assistance from the district. A question arose, "Is there a district fund available to cover costs?" Cabinet Treasurer replied "the Sight Conservation (Vision Services) fund is available if approved. A motion was made/supported to authorize up to \$1000 if the Vision Services committee has a qualified applicant for assistance.

A motion to adjourn was made and supported at 3:27 pm. Motion passed.

### Diabetes Committee Report 11 D-1 August 21, 2011

As you all probably know, the Diabetes Committee has a substantial amount of dollars (currently over \$16,000) in its budget. That money comes from the blood, sweat, and hard work of our fellow Lions and I feel a great responsibility to find ways to distribute those funds to people who need them; that money isn't doing anyone any good sitting in a bank account! Our proposed goal for this year is to establish criteria for eligibility, locate people who are in need of some help with their diabetes-related expenses, and put that money to work where it can do the most good.

From talking to people, from PDGs to our Executive Director, it seems the previous focus has been on diabetes awareness, or education. There are many other organizations that do an effective job in that area and it may not make sense to duplicate those efforts and compete with them.

So, what can we do to put those dollars to work in the most effective manner to help those in need?

To that end, I've developed an application form (attached) and propose that it be distributed to some of the free clinics in each of the four counties we serve as well as making it available to each Lions Club in our District. We can always add locations later depending on how much response we get.

I've spoken to Lori Hanover who is a social worker at AGES Senior Health Care in Saginaw, and she would also like some of the applications if they're approved. She sees substantial need with her Geriatric patients.

I've also been in contact with one of the meter companies, and am working on a proposal that we provide a free meter, supplied by the company, and a supply (perhaps 6 months) of test strips, supplied by the District, to those who need one and cannot afford them.

There is also a camp for diabetic kids in Fenton, MI and we may have an opportunity to help some kids from our district whose families cannot afford to send them attend next summer.

I've talked to the other Diabetes Committee members about helping us find people in our communities who need a helping hand with diabetes related expenses and about bringing suggestions and ideas to the table.
