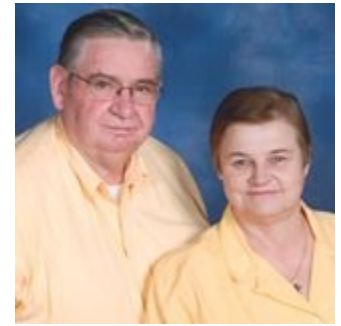

**Good News Floridians!** Governor Rick Scott approved SB 156 - the legislation that decreases fees for license/vehicle registration. As this frees up a few extra dollars, please remember to check the box to donate a dollar to programs for children and/or seniors with impaired vision when you register or renew a vehicle. Your donation, together with those of other Floridians, provides significant support to agencies blind children and adults throughout Florida. The Conklin Center has received \$8,225 from this program and \$18,701 from the State of Vision tag program since it started in 2011.

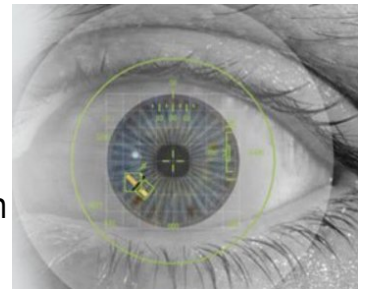
