As Zone Chairman in 3A back in 2008, we decided to have a project. Being an avid golfer in a community with several courses and leagues it seemed like a perfect fit. In talking with some of the local golf professionals, we decided to revive the LaPorte County Golf Tournament. People shared with us what a "great event" this was back in the 70's & 80's attracting several hundred golfers of all ages. So we set about planning this great event.

We contacted each of the clubs, 6 in our zone, and ask them to put up seed money and appoint two Lions to serve on our committee. We asked one of the local golf professionals to serve on the committee to help guide us through the process. Everything went very well except for one major problem. This was the year the economy took a dive and we could not get golfers to participate. "You cannot hold a golf tournament without golfers"! With a week before the tournament we only had about 15 golfers and we had to cancel the tournament.

The committee met and decided that this was still a good idea and our clubs all rallied behind us and we decided to make it a golf scramble in 2009. Our goal has always been to provide a "First Class Outing" that people will look forward to each year and in which our Lions can make a profit. The first year we made a few hundred dollars for each club and it has grown a little each year since. This past year 2012, we made a profit of \$6,000.

The real value of having a zone project is that club members come together and get to know each other a little more. We share information about what is happening in each club and support projects of the other clubs in the zone. This is additional work for a few members of each club but the actual event brings together many members on that day.

The golf outing is what we choose to do but I'm sure there are many other ideas for projects. My thought would be for each Zone Chairman to reach out to your clubs and see what ideas they might have for a "Zone Project". It may be a little late this year but let's always be looking to the future. We did not give up when, falling on our faces, the first year. Remember, Lions never give up!

Diabetes Awareness Needs your Help!

Each year, nearly 15,000 children develop Type 1 diabetes in the United States. In addition to this increase in the incidence of Type 1 diabetes, a shocking increase in childhood obesity has contributed to an equally disturbing increase in Type 2 diabetes in children. At least 740,000 Hoosiers have diabetes, which equates to a prevalence of about 9.8 % of the population. Diabetes is the 6th leading cause of death in Indiana.

Until a cure is discovered, a child with diabetes must give themselves regular injections—typically four or more per day. *That's more than 1,000 shots every year.* They must also test their blood glucose levels by pricking their fingers as often as *four to five times a day*. Children who are lucky enough to understand and afford an insulin pump can escape the injections, but must still check their blood glucose frequently. In 2010 a 2 year commitment was made to Riley Hospital for Children for equipment to advance research into a cure for type 1 diabetes. This commitment was completed in July 2011. The Indiana Lions Diabetes Awareness Committee with approval from the Council of Governors has pledged \$15000 over a 2 year period to purchase additional equipment needed to enhance their research into a diabetes cure at Riley Hospital for Children. To achieve this goal the support of the Lions Clubs in Indiana is paramount.

If every club in MD 25 who contributed to Diabetes Awareness last year increased their financial support by a mere \$5-10 per year over the next 2 years and every club who has not support diabetes in the past would contribute at least \$5-10 a year for 2 years we would easily accomplish our goal.

This would also allow the committee to maintain its present level of support to the diabetes camps in Indiana. For additional information check your district directory for your diabetes awareness committee member. Invite them to a meeting.
