

## From Second Vice District Governor GLENN SWANSON

#### LIFE IN THE 1500'S

What was life like in the 1500's? Most people got married in June because they took their yearly bath in May, and were still smelling pretty good by June. However, they were starting to smell, so brides carried a bouquet of flowers to hide the body odor.

Baths equaled a tub filled with hot water. The man of the house had the privilege of the nice clean water, then all the other sons and men, then the women and finally the children. Last of all, the babies. By then the water was so dirty you could actually lose someone in it. Hence the saying, "don't throw the baby out with the bath water".


Houses had thatched roofs. Thick straw, piled high, with no wood underneath. It was the only place for animals to get warm, so all the pets... dogs, cats and other small animals, mice rats, bugs lived in the roof. When it rained it became slippery and sometimes the animals would slip off the roof. Hence the saying, "It's raining cats and dogs".

There was nothing to stop things from falling into the house. This posed a real problem in the bedroom where bugs and other droppings could really mess up your nice clean bed. So, they found if they made beds with big posts and hung a sheet over the top, it addressed that problem. Hence, those big beautiful big four poster beds with canopies.

They cooked in the kitchen in a big kettle that always hung over the fire. Every day they lit the fire and added things to the pot. They mostly ate vegetables and didn't get much meat. They would eat stew for dinner leaving leftovers in the pot to get cold overnight and then start over the next day. Sometimes the stew had food in it that had been in there for a month. Hence the rhyme: Peas porridge hot, Peas porridge cold, Peas porridge in the pot nine days old".

Lead cups were used to drink ale or whiskey. The combination would sometimes knock them out for a couple of days. Someone walking along the road would take them for dead and prepare them for burial. They were laid out on the kitchen table for a couple of days and the family would gather around and eat and drink and wait and see if they would wake up. Hence the custom, of holding a "wake".

## A Thank You

**The 25-A Mission Group** applied for a LCIF matching grant back in September, 2012. We received word that the International Board of Directors approved it in December 2012, at their Meeting In Indianapolis. The grant totaled \$37,210. The mission group along with many clubs helped come up with ½ the total, which was \$17,605.

All of the equipment has been ordered, and most of it we have received. Two [2] Plus Optix SO 9 cameras were ordered. One [1] for District F, and one [1] for District A. And a Humphrey FDT vision field instrument used for checking glaucoma in our adult screenings. Also purchased were two [2] auto refractors to replace our old ones. One [1] will be left in Mexico for both Districts A and F to use on our missions. Also Dalia can use it when doing mini missions in Mexico.

Both District A & F decided that one [1] more SO9 needed to be purchased for each District and two [2] more units were ordered at a reduced price. Cost of each camera came to around \$6,000 each with trade in of some old cameras that are not used anymore.

At this time we are waiting on the two [2] auto refractors. Once all the equipment is in our possession a final report will be made out and sent to International and a copy to the District Governor. And a copy kept in the Mission group files for future reference.

The two [2] SO9,s are out in the District and being used. The FDT machine will be used as we start doing adult screenings this spring at health fairs, and at Council on Aging centers that seniors meet.

Mission group and I would like to express our thanks for all the clubs in the District for your contributions and support to make this all possible. Without it a lot of Grants could not be gotten, and much needed equipment could not be purchased to help with the eye screenings.
