## KNIGHTS FOR THE BLIND

Born in Tuscumbia, Alabama, USA, in 1880, Helen Keller developed a fever at 18 months of age that left her blind and deaf.

With the help of an exceptional teacher, Anne Mansfield Sullivan of the Perkins School for the Blind, Keller learned sign language and Braille. A few years later, she learned to speak. As an adult she became a tireless advocate for people with disabilities. And on June 30 1925, Keller attended the Lions Clubs International Convention at Cedar Point, Ohio, USA and challenged Lions to become "knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness." This is her speech

**Dear Lions and Ladies:**

*I suppose you have heard the legend that represents opportunity as a capricious lady, who knocks at every door but once, and if the door isn't opened quickly, she passes on, never to return. And that is as it should be. Lovely, desirable ladies won't wait. You have to go out and grab 'em.*

*I am your opportunity. I am knocking at your door. I want to be adopted. The legend doesn't say what you are to do when several beautiful opportunities present themselves at the same door. I guess you have to choose the one you love best. I hope you will adopt me. I am the youngest here, and what I offer you is full of splendid opportunities for service.*

*The American Foundation for the Blind is only four years old. It grew out of the imperative needs of the blind, and was called into existence by the sightless themselves. It is national and international in scope and in importance. It represents the best and most enlightened thought on our subject that has been reached so far. Its object is to make the lives of the blind more worthwhile everywhere by increasing their economic value and giving them the joy of normal activity.*

*Try to imagine how you would feel if you were suddenly stricken blind today. Picture yourself stumbling and groping at noonday as in the night; your work, your independence, gone. In that dark world wouldn't you be glad if a friend took you by the hand and said, "Come with me*

*and I will teach you how to do some of the things you used to do when you could see?" That is just the kind of friend the American Foundation is going to be to all the blind in this country if seeing people will give it the support it must have.*

*You have heard how through a little word dropped from the fingers of another, a ray of light from another soul touched the darkness of my mind and I found myself, found the world, found God. It is because my teacher learned about me and broke through the dark, silent imprisonment which held me that I am able to work for myself and for others. It is the caring we want more than money. The gift without the sympathy and interest of the giver is empty. If you care, if we can make the people of this great country care, the blind will indeed triumph over blindness.*



*The opportunity I bring to you, Lions, is this: To foster and sponsor the work of the American Foundation for the Blind. Will you not help me hasten the day when there shall be no preventable blindness; no little deaf, blind child untaught; no blind man or woman unaided? I appeal to you Lions, you who have your sight, your hearing, you who are strong and brave and kind. Will you not constitute yourselves Knights of the Blind in this crusade against darkness?*

*I thank you.*

In response to the challenge the Lions of District 410 started Lions Operation Brightsight which provides corrective spectacles to the underprivileged people throughout the Republic of South Africa as well as the neighbouring states. Since its inception in July 1978 thousands of spectacles have been distributed to people, bringing smiles to the faces of senior citizens and children and indigents. Without the help of Lions Clubs and Operation Brightsight they would have gone through life with impaired vision. The objective is to receive prescriptions from Lions Clubs, Provincial Hospitals, Optometric Clinics, and various other organisations and to process these scripts at low cost using pre-owned frames that are in excellent condition fitted, with new prescription lenses.

On Wed Oct 05 2011, Lion Vimla and PDG Ramkumar visited Operation Brightsight, in Johannesburg and handed over more than 1000 eye glasses collected by Lions Club of Lobatse, for recycling. In a true gesture of the brotherhood the Lions of Lobatse showed that wherever there is need Lions should avail themselves to help without thinking of man made boundaries

We salute the Lions of Lobatse for rising to the challenge and to be true **Knights of the Blind**

## CABINET MEETING TRAVEL EXPENSES

**ALL VOTING** cabinet officers attending cabinet meetings will have their costs reimbursed as follows:

- (a) An individual voting cabinet officer **or** (2) two voting cabinet officers traveling in one motor vehicle to attend a cabinet meeting will **each** be reimbursed one way mileage at the approved rate, plus the costs of a single visa entry, road tax and vehicle insurance costs when entering either - Botswana, Malawi, Mozambique or Zimbabwe, receipts must be attached to claim form.
- (b) A minimum of (3) three voting cabinet officers traveling in one motor vehicle to attend a cabinet meeting will be reimbursed in full, from the farthest point, for the following expenses - fuel, a single visa entry, road tax and vehicle insurance costs when entering either - Botswana, Malawi, Mozambique or Zimbabwe, receipts must be attached to claim form. Only one claim form to be submitted.

***Fuel Reimbursement Explanation:** Start journey with a full tank of fuel, on arrival at cabinet meeting destination fill the fuel tank, this receipted amount, plus en route refueling receipted amounts, will give the amount of fuel used one way, double it and that is the total amount of fuel to be claimed.*

**This is also applicable to Past District Governors** who may attend the cabinet meetings. **Passengers, who are not voting or non-voting cabinet officers, do not claim.**

Claim forms are available from the cabinet treasurer for those cabinet officers who wish to claim, completed forms are returned to Cabinet Treasurer.

## WMMR - 2011-2012 LCI & D412 & CLUB OFFICERS ACCESS

**“Welcome Lions Club Officer!**

I would like to update you regarding some of the features of Lions Clubs International’s **web monthly membership reporting site** (WMMR) as well as new enhancements to the web site which may assist you in your position as a club officer.

The **WMMR web site** provides the ability to keep track of club officers, members and activities and submit monthly membership reports, generate service activity reports, club rosters and other reports.

**Club Presidents and Secretaries** are able to modify club member information, view club statements and generate reports.

**Treasurers** are able to view member data, print reports, view club statements and make payments. If you use WMMR to submit your monthly reports, you do not need to send a paper copy to headquarters.

We have recently **redesigned the password and log on process for WMMR.**

To access WMMR you will need **your member number and password**. If you are new to WMMR you can create your own user name and password by clicking “**New User? Click here to Register Now**” on the log on page and follow the on-screen prompts to select a user name and password; note, you will be asked questions to confirm your identity and you will be required to provide a unique e-mail address. If you used WMMR in 2010 – 2011 you will be able to use the password you already have.

With the tremendous efforts of our international Board Appointee PID Manoj Shah and PID Dr S.P Amin, who provided us with the utmost and sincere assistance and guidance for the ongoing famine crises in the horn of Africa, we have already completed our first relief efforts with the Red Cross where we managed to send 8 tonnes of relief supplies to the affected victims

Under their directions, I authorised our Lions of Kenya to go out to the affected areas to distribute our second emergency relief supplies, I am pleased to report that a few lions from Nairobi and other volunteers went into the far north eastern region under military escort to give out food relief and drinking water



It took our Lions under the dynamic leadership of Lion Irshad Sumra 2 days to get there and spend two days giving vital supplies .Lion Sumra is unable to describe to us the horror he has seen

The Lions of Beirut also came and went out to the affected areas with them to assist the unfortunate and we have more plans to further assist in the coming days with the assistance of US\$15000 from LCIF as our request for the Emergency grant.



I take this opportunity to salute the Lions of our District 411A, LCIF and Lions of the world for their support in our effort to assist the most vulnerable victims of this worst famine to hit the horn of Africa in the last 3 decades.

It is proud to be associated with the Lions for having the opportunity to serve the needy and I believe that together we can alleviate the suffering of those who are caught in this tragedy

## WORLD SIGHT DAY COMMEMORATION

This day is commemorated in Botswana annually on the 2nd Thursday of October. The theme for this year was **"Sight is a Team Effort"**. The venue for the occasion was the Mahalapye Hospital. The day began with a March at 6.00 hours followed by a ceremony which ended at 12.30 hours; during which participants heard from Botswana's Vision 2020 Initiatives & Prevention of Blindness Coordinator - Mrs. A. Lehasa, the Indian High Commissioner - H.E. Mr. M. Chandra, the Guest Speaker - Minister of Health Hon. Rev. Dr. John Seakgosing. He informed that there were doctors from India under the theme **"The Right to Sight"** who are in Botswana to conduct approximately 2000 cataract eye operations at different hospitals in Botswana. The doctors, some of whom were present were thanked for their significant contribution to the Botswana community. The doctors were during the week conducting surgeries at the Mahalapye hospital and two of the **Pseudophakic Motivators** (recipients of the surgery) were allowed to express their appreciation to the doctors and encourage other members of the community to take care of their eyes. Participants also learned that there was need for all persons over 40 years to check for glaucoma annually. The Honourable Minister emphasized that government and non governmental organizations should continue to build strong bonds of friendship through co-operation and partnership. Dr. Oathokwa Nkomazana - President of Botswana Eye Care Providers Society & Chairperson for National Prevention of Blindness Committee informed everyone that cataract is the most widespread of all eye diseases and can be corrected with minor surgery which is conducted in less than 20 minutes. She said the Chinese government also had doctors coming to the Government hospital previously to conduct cataract surgeries and donated equipment of more than P1,000,000.00. The Lions Club was also mentioned as another donor of eye equipment and spectacles. District Governor Lion Frances was requested to address the gathering on the work of Lions in our district, highlighting some of the contributions made by Lions in Botswana. PDG Lion Col. (ret'd.) Tekemanangathe Ramkumar (District Global Leadership Team Leader), Lion Vimla Ramkumar (District Trainer & DAC Peace Poster), Lion Brian Maeza (Guiding Lion for the new Mahalapye Village Lions Club), Lion Rachel Tsebagale (member of Lobatse Lions Club) and Lion Kelape Marapo (member of Francistown Lions Club) were acknowledged by the DG to the gathering for their presence at the event. During the ceremony invitees were entertained with Music from the Botswana Prisons Service (Mahalapye), dances and drama from the local schools, singing by youths of the community. A tour of the Mahalapye Eye ward and facilities thereafter followed, this was led by the Guest Speaker and the Indian High Commissioner, after which invitees were provided with the opportunity to network, have fun and fellowship.
