Sight 4 Kidz

One of the most rewarding Lions Service Project for me in my 17 years of being a Lions member has been the Sight 4 Kidz project. It will be 6 years this April when my husband and I were trained. That following May, I started promoting FREE vision screenings. Our first 3 daycare eye screenings were in Napoleon on June 9, 2015 with the Plusoptix mobile vision screener. Two other Napoleon Lions members helped me that day.

My first actual screening was a disaster. I had the jitters and forgot the steps where to find the preloaded child's name. The camera locked up on me due to faulty batteries. I forgot to do the screening in a darkened room instead of under the light. This all happened with the first 12 kids. After calling my trainer for information, the next two child day care screenings that day went well. She encouraged me by saying "after you have 200 screened you will be a pro". She was right, I became hooked.

The Southcentral ND communities that I have screened in the past years include Steele, Napoleon, Wishek, Linton, Ashley, Lehr, Kulm, Edgeley, La Moure, Fullerton, Gackle, Jamestown and Valley City.

Daycares were our top priority screening children age 6 months to 6 years. After the word got around about this awesome FREE eye screening

service; the County Nurses requested screening in the public schools.

It was a very busy summer June of 2015. We screened 131 children in nine daycares in the month of June. The referral rate was 10% with a total of 13 children referred to see their eye doctor.

Many vendor fairs were attended where I promoted the Lions organization and our free vision screenings. Visitors at our booth were interested. I put articles in the Ashley Tribune, Wishek Star and the Napoleon Homestead, Kulm Messenger, church bulletins, posters in businesses. After the word was out about this Lions Service Project, the interested parties started contacting me to set up dates. Occasionally the Stutsman County Community Action Day Care in Jamestown asked for help.

The most recent requests are from the McIntosh County Public Schools of Wishek and Ashley. The dates of March 11, 2021 at Wishek and March 19, 2021 at Ashley are scheduled. There is an interest for me to attend the Linton Dairy Days this summer for a screening in June.

Good eyesight is so important. This project is made possible through the support and cooperation of LCIF and LFND. I am happy to be a part of this program. Our motto is "We Serve"

despite his circumstances. He touched the lives of many people during his battle. One of them being Carson Wentz, as Landon had a great liking for the Philadelphia Eagles football team. He also liked NDSU athletics very much as well. Coach Dave Richman, head basketball coach at NDSU, wore a LANDON'S LIGHT t-shirt for much of the season as did the players for warm-up. Landon got national attention, as Coach Richman wore the t-shirt during the NCCA "March Madness" Tournament. (Coach Richman and Landon were next door neighbors in South Fargo) Landon passed away from this earth on September 17, 2019. At Landon's funeral there were over 1,000 people in attendance at Scheels Arena in Fargo. Mary Ellen

Rolfson talked about Landon's Light Foundation and what they do. Their main focus is to help young children that have some type of medical condition such as cancer and provide financial assistance to organizations benefiting children in similar situations. The foundation also inspires children to grow academically, in their faith and physical well-being through scholarships and sponsorships. A few of the foundation's special programs include; Miracle Moment, Project Kindness and 10 Days of Kindness. The foundation also offers special scholarships. District 5NW Club New Lions Member Challenge 2021



Awards for the District 5NW Club Challenge were given at the Spring Rally in Halliday, ND on April 10th, 2021. Every year the Club Challenge is introduced between January 1st and the evening before the Spring Rally. This year's Club New Lions Member Challenge was even more challenging due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. But through this year District 5NW is continuing to add new Lions.

The first place Club, gaining the most Lions Members on the LCI Website, is the Arnegard Lions Club. They added four new Lions between January 1st and April 9th. The winning prize they earned is three FREE Registrations for the ND State Lions Convention in Watford City, ND. The Glenburn Lions Club are the second place winner by adding two new Lions during the Challenge and earned two FREE Registrations for the Lions ND State Convention in Watford City, ND. The Glenburn Lions Club has gained seven new Lions this Lions' year.

Last year the District 5NW Club Challenge was introduced to run from January 1st through June 12th, the evening before the Joint Virtual District 5NW-5NE Spring Rally. There were the additional challenges of the COVID-19 Pandemic, but several Lions Clubs stepped up to the task. One first place Lions Club, the Bowman Lions Club, with four new Lions. There was a tie among four Lions Clubs for second place bringing in three new Lions members each. The District Governor Team decided to award second place to all four Lions Clubs. They are Halliday Lions Club, Lake Metigoshe Lions Club, Minot Lions Club and the Williston Lions Club. We are proud of every one of these Lions Clubs. They brought in 16 new Lions during the beginning of the Pandemic. The first place Lions Club from last year will also receive three FREE Registrations for the ND State Lions Convention in Watford City, ND and all four second place winners will receive two FREE Registrations.
