



PID Vannett and PDG Lewellyn Rustan to be inducted into the Lions Hall of Fame

We are very fortunate to have two special Lions who will be inducted into the North Dakota Lions Hall of Fame on Friday, April 23 at a banquet sponsored by the Past District Governors. The induction ceremony will be held at the Municipal Country Club in Bismarck and friends, relatives, and members of the inductee's club are all welcome to come for the festivities.

Our two outstanding honorees are PID Pat Vannett of the Mandan Lions Club, and PDG Lewellyn Rustan of the New England Lions Club. Their biographies are below:



PID Patricia "Pat" Vannett

Past International Director Patricia "Pat" Vannett has been a Lion since 2003, and is currently a member of the Mandan Lions Club. From the time she first joined the Lions organization, she has been unafraid to undertake new challenges, and her endeavors in Lions led to her election to

the International Lions Board beginning on June 30, 2017 at the Chicago convention. During her term on the Board, she served on the Finance Committee and was the inaugural chairperson of the newly formed Technology Committee, 2018-2019.

During PID Pat's early Lions' years she held many club offices including club president, and then zone chairperson. She became District 5NW Governor in 2011-2012. She attended the Great Plains Lions Leadership Institute in 2009 and returned as a presenter in 2014 and 2016. She has been a presenter at numerous North Dakota Lions Conventions and several conventions and rallies outside of her district and multiple-district, including the Northern Pride Leadership Forum in 2016 and 2018. She was a faculty member for the Advanced Lions Leadership Institute in 2015.

Lion Pat is a graduate of the Faculty Development Institute and the Faculty Development Excellence Series and was awarded her Master's Degree from Lions University at the USA Canada Forum.

Most Lions of North Dakota are acquainted with Pat because of her involvement in the "Sight 4 Kidz" program, which, under the umbrella of the Lions Foundation of

North Dakota, began in 2015 and whose aim it was to screen the vision of as many pre-school children as possible in the state. It was Lion Pat and her team who spearheaded the raising of \$55,000 in matching funds across the state in order to purchase 13 Plusoptix screeners, and then train Lion volunteers to use those screeners in local daycares and pre-schools. This has been a tremendously successful program, with nearly 100,000 children having been screened in North Dakota since the program's inception.

PID Vannett is currently serving as District 5NW North American Membership Initiative Champion, and area leader on the Global Action Team, and chairperson of the Multiple District International Liaison Committee.

In recognition of her service to the association, Lion Pat has received numerous awards, including an Extension Award, a Membership Key Award, an International Leadership Award, and four International President's awards. She is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, and a Second Century Ambassador. PID Pat also received the Ambassador of Good Will Award from Lions Clubs International in 2019.

When not active with Li-

ons activities, she has been busy in her career as a realtor. She has been active in numerous professional and community organizations, including the Renaissance Zone Committee, Mandan Progress Organization, and the Mandan Parade Committee. She is a long-time church choir member.

Lion Pat and her husband, Past District Governor Kevin Vannett, also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, share five children and three grandchildren.

and community experiences which he credits for making leadership in Lions a natural progression.

His first six years of education were in a one-room country schoolhouse, and he later graduated from New England Public School in 1959. His experience in Future Farmers of America at a young age led to a state FFA office, where he first experienced public speaking to crowds.

Lion Lewellyn attended North Dakota State University for two years, and was inducted into the US Army the day after President Kennedy's funeral. He served in a Military Police unit in Fort Sam Houston, TX. He was discharged in 1965 with a dual Military Police and Clerical MOS.

Lewellyn returned home to the family farm raising small grains and cattle. He is still the manager of a family partnership, with tenants farming the land.

Community service has always been close to his heart, beginning with the New England Jaycees. Over the years, he established two non-profit corporations, a cemetery association and the New England Community Arts Committee. He has served on the boards of his church, township, and Badlands Ministries.

It wasn't until 1997 that Lewellyn joined the New England Lions Club, bringing with him this wealth of community service experience. He has been active in many Lions positions in his club, district, and state. He became a District Governor in 2012. In 2013 he spearheaded a public relations project utilizing a \$3333 LCIF Grant to

place Lions advertisements in every newspaper (35) in District 5NW, and wrote letters to all clubs encouraging them to share information about their club activities in their communities.

He has spent 15 years on the District Cabinet in different positions, and wrote president, treasurer, membership, and parliamentary procedure manuals. He has served as secretary of the Lions Foundation of North Dakota, creating a Board Member handbook, bringing organizational records up to date, and certifying and clarifying the 501 (c) (3) IRS tax status of the organization. While also on the Foundation, he worked with the committee to secure a \$55,000 LCIF matching grant for Sight 4 Kidz.

He has had a many-faceted career, including working into a top management position with a national company with more than 225 sales representatives. He later began a roofing and painting business utilizing that product line. He has also worked in journalism as a writer and ad salesman. In 2000 Lewellyn and a partner began a tree transplanting business, which he continues to operate, relocating very large trees.

Lewellyn was instrumental in establishing the Dakota Women's Correctional Rehab Center in New England, utilizing the vacant former New England St. Mary's School. It has been stated that without his involvement, it could not have happened.

PDG Lewellyn has two daughters, a son-in-law, and two grandchildren, who live nearby. His companion of 19 years is Jean Beyer.

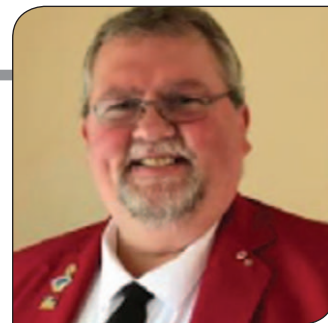

The International Lions Youth Outreach Award was presented to him in 1998 and he received the International President's Award for Service Recognition in both 2006 and 2008. Used eyeglasses were stacked in boxes all over his house for years as he coordinated Lions members in the processing of these glasses to be shipped to third world countries for distribution to those in need.
